

Actress Returns To Video After Try At Religion

HOLLYWOOD (UP)—Penny Edwards, the beauty who gave up movies for religion two years ago, today is back at work in television. The pretty blonde made news when she announced she was forsaking grease paint to be a missionary and preacher for the Seventh Day Adventist Church.

But this week the good Penny turned up again—as the heroine wooed by Clint Walker in "Cheyenne," one of the series shows on ABC-TV's "Warner Bros. Presents."

I found the new Penny different from the actress who was starred in 26 films before she took up religion. She no longer has bright blonde, long hair. Her locks are darker and shorter. She refuses to take "evil" roles or pose for leg art in films.

NORMAL LOOK DESIRED
"As far as makeup and costumes for roles go, I believe in moderation," she explained. "I just want to look normal."

Penny insists that by returning to show business she doesn't feel like a person who is given a farewell party and then never leaves. Nancy Valentine and June Haver

also left society for religious seclusion, but returned. "I definitely intended to quit movies two years ago," she said. "I am very sincere about my religion. I don't feel I've changed my mind. I think I've grown in my religion with a better understanding of people and the world."

GOD PUT FIRST
"After a time I became convinced it is entirely possible to live and work in Hollywood and still have God first in my life. If you love God you don't have to do the evil things you see around you."

During her two years off the screen, Penny and her husband, agent Ralph Winters, made seven religious films for showing in churches only. They also appeared on religious TV programs.

They gave sermons at churches, held bible classes in their home three nights a week and toured the country to give "testimony" at evangelist meetings.

"And we had two babies," she smiled. "I found peace and happiness and security. And I found God didn't mean us to be hermits. So I returned to my career. But I still will continue with my church work."
