Utah Becomes Top Eisenhower Country After Slow Warmup

SALT LAKE CITY (U)—A political survey of Utah points straight at one conclusion: this is now Eisenhower country.
President Eisenhower carried the state in 1952 although most top Republicans in Utah preferred the late Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio for the nomination.
Even so bitter a critic as Republican Gov. J. Bracken Lee says now that Eisenhower is more popular than he was four years ago. (Not with Lee, though.)
"I'm perfectly satisfied with the administration," a young clerk says from behind the counter of a general store in Layton. He voted for Eisenhower in '52.
In pro-Democratic Ogden, an old time railroad man says he voted for Adlai Stevenson last time and may do so again. But he adds, "I feel Ike has done a good job."

PERSONAL APPEAL
Aside from Eisenhower's personal appeal, two factors work against Democratic prospects. One is business prosperity. The other is Ezra Taft Benson and the Mormon Church.
Retail trade, which broke all records nationally and locally in December, jumped 10 to 15 per cent above 1955 in January. Fabricated metals plants are six months behind in production. Copper mill payrolls are big and steady. Bank deposits are "way up."
