Post Begins Fund Drive

The auxiliary, unit No. 8, of the Klamath Falls Post, American Legion is again launching a magazine subscription drive to raise money for the purchase of hospital equipment which may be used free of charge by those needing it. Similar drives have been conducted for the last eight years by the Klamath Falls unit and hospital equipment including hospital beds, wheel chairs and crutches have been placed with auxiliary units in Lakeview, Merrill, Malin and Tulelake through this program.

Currently on hand are hospital beds, crutches, wheel chairs and a walker. In past years a polo pack heater was presented to the Klamath County Nursing Home by the unit and a neophore with nebulizer and an incubator to Klamath Valley Hospital.

Equipment for loan is in constant use.

The subscription drive, which starts September 5, will be conducted by trained personnel who will carry letters of authorization, signed by members of the unit's executive board, subscription chairmen and co-chairmen.
