Labor Day Traffic Here Approached Near Record

Traffic at the California state agricultural quarantine stations at Dorris and Tulelake—an excellent barometer of auto travel in and out of the Klamath Basin from the south—approached near record levels over the Labor Day weekend, officials of the Bureau of Plant Quarantine reported yesterday.

However, figures at both stations indicated that more people went to California from Oregon for the weekend than came to Oregon from California.

The reports—which show southbound traffic only—at Dorris list 1,750 cars on Saturday, 1,350 on Sunday and 1,435 on Monday. At the Tulelake station, located south of Newell, the figures are 541 on Saturday, 374 on Sunday and 350 on Monday.

In both cases, the figures are for passenger cars only. The time period for each day is from 12:01 a.m. to midnight.

From the figures, it can be seen that there were more southbound cars on the first day of the weekend. Although there are no com-

parable counts for northbound traffic, presumably there would be a reverse trend, showing more northbound cars on Monday.

Carl Sierra, senior inspector at Dorris, said that the count Saturday was "one of the largest we have ever had" since the inspection system was set up. Traffic at Tulelake was described as "quite heavy" with the daily average count in the vicinity of 300 cars.

Sunday was the heaviest day of the weekend at Grater Lake National Park, when 1,755 autos carrying 6,267 persons entered the park. On Saturday, 1,231 cars with 4,066 persons went through the checking stations, and on Monday, 1,128 autos with 3,982 persons entered the park.

Camping at the park dropped sharply on Monday, when 192 campers were registered at the four campgrounds. On Sunday, there were 508 campers and on Saturday, there were 597.

Park officials said that figures for other holidays were not "immediately available."

Weed School Figures Told

WEED — Registration at the Weed Union Elementary School was 674 this week, the first day's registration totaling 14 over the expected enrollment. These figures compare with 630 registrations the first day last year and 579 of 1954.

Leno Lenzi, principal, stated a higher registration is now expected. An unusually large first grade class numbering 66 and kindergarten with 87 has added to the problems of the school opening.

Mrs. Evelyn Mason, a first grade teacher, will be replaced due to injuries received in an auto accident in Montana while en route to Weed for the school opening which will require her hospitalization for nearly a year. She had taught several years at the Weed school and was returning from summer

school when the accident occurred.

There will be no school September 10, California Admission Day, or September 14, teachers institute.
