GOLDEN PEACH SHORTCAKE A LA MODE

(Makes 6 servings)
2 cups sifted enriched
flour
1 tablespoon sugar
4 teaspoons double-
acting baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup Golden Fluff
1 egg, slightly beaten
1/2 cup milk
2 tablespoons melted
Fluff
3 cups sliced peaches,
fresh, frozen, or
canned
1 pint vanilla ice cream

Combine dry ingredients in bowl. Cut
in 1/2 cup Fluff with a pastry blender
or two knives till mixture looks like
coarse cornmeal. Add egg and milk;
stir gently with a fork till dough holds
together. Gather dough into a ball,
turn it onto a lightly floured board
and knead gently, about 10 times.
Roll dough 1/4-inch thick. Cut 12
rounds with a floured 3-inch cutter.
Place 6 rounds on an ungreased
baking sheet; brush them with the
2 tablespoons melted Fluff, top
with remaining rounds. Bake at
425°F. about 10 minutes, or until a
medium brown. Split each shortcake; fill and top with
delicious sliced peaches (sweeten
fresh peaches to taste). Top with
your favorite ice cream.

Fall Fashions

The collection for Fall of 1956,
designed by Will Saunders for Arkey,
has been aptly named the
American Political Look, thus
called because of a newly re-
strained elegance and look of im-
peccable tailoring which domi-
nates—a sense of dignity and quiet
appropriateness easily identifiable
with the political life of this coun-
try.
A large collection of tailored
daytime dresses, both slim and
full skirts, is featured; as well as
a smaller group of cocktail dress-
es which definitely fit into the
"glamour" category (and would
indeed be charming additions to
any Congressional Ball).
Sheaths are slimmer, more
avante than ever—sheer line ac-
cented by custom details which
lend a unique individuality to each
number. The full skirts are cre-
ated with a similar look in mind
and either flare gracefully, are
subtly pleated or feature crisp all
over knife pleats. One particu-
larly important look is The Sub-
Committee Silhouette, a one piece
"little suit" feeling perfect for city
lunches (and going on to dinner
with ease), which appears in both
sheaths and in full skirted dresses.
And Will Saunders' Loyalty Sil-
houette (so called because of its
faithful adherence to body lines)
is the perfect corollary to a pre-
tly figure, is also seen in dresses
with flared skirts as well as in
sheaths.
Back interest is a dominant fash-
ion trend in the collection and
softly bloused backs, softened
skirts, as well as unusual versions
of the flying panel, show up often.
Will Saunders' Pentagon Panel, a
wide back pleat reaching from
waist to hem, is a new fashion
note for sheaths; and creates a
jaunty look perfect for a Pennsylv-
ania Avenue promenade.
The color story is equally ex-
citing. Vibrant tones of reds,
blues and greens, misty beiges
and blues, dominate; and political
names have been given to those
shades most often featured.
Senatorial Blue, Independence
Red, Washington Cherry, Amba-
sador Beige, Royale, Wheat Belt
Beige and Royalist Red are among
the most important. Congressional
Black (for black will always be
woman's most secure fashion post)
is also often used—in silk and vel-
vet cocktail dresses as well as in
tailored wool numbers with a mul-
titude of uses.
Novelty weaves in tweeds and
flocks supplement the solid col-
ored wools and wool jerseys for
daytime wear; while bold plaids
(such as United Nations Peace
Plaid and dramatic Atlantic Tre-
aty Plaid, exclusive with Arkey);
checks (Veto, a wide check); and
multi-colored wools all hold im-
portant daytime positions. Detail
trim for daytime is in satin, faille
and soutache.

MILK CONTAINERS

Never pour a quart of milk from
its container into a pitcher for
refrigeration, say home econo-
mists. The pitcher may be less
safe than the container which
comes from the creamery in an
absolutely sterile condition. An-
other reason for not transferring the
contents of a container of milk is
that it raises the temperature a
degree or more, thus increasing
chances of flavor loss and hasten-
ing souring of the milk.
