Oregon War Orphans Set For Schooling Benefits

Approximately 1,350 war orphans in Oregon will soon be eligible for generous schooling benefits under an act approved by the 54th Congress, Ted Case, Oregon Department of Veterans Affairs officer for Klamath Falls, said today.

The measure, termed the "war orphans' educational assistance act of 1956," provides government educational benefits to children of veterans or servicemen who died of injuries or diseases resulting from their service in World War I, World War II or the Korean conflict.

The benefits, amounting to \$10 a month for up to 36 months, take effect starting October 1, so eligible persons were urged to apply immediately if they plan to attend school this fall.

In Oregon, application is filed with the Veterans Administration regional office, 208 S. W. Fifth Avenue, Portland. Forms are available from the state veterans' department or county service officers.

Counseling by VA personnel to establish an educational, vocational or professional objective must be given in every case.

Under the law, the children must be between 18 and 23, although in some instances they will be permitted to begin schooling before their 18th birthday and to finish after their 23rd. High school courses, on the job training, on farm training and correspondence courses are not covered.

In Salem, Rex Putnam, state superintendent of public instruction, termed the benefit "a splendid educational opportunity for the children of our war dead," and said he would be glad to help them.

Balloon Fells Russian Jet

LONDON (UP) — Communist Poland said today a propaganda balloon launched by Radio Free Europe downed a Polish MIG15 jet trainer on Aug. 3 with the loss of two lives.

A government statement broadcast by PAP, the official Polish agency, said careful investigation showed the MIG fell as result of hitting a hydrogen-filled balloon carrying leaflets.

It said the accident occurred early in the morning near Sobieszew and identified the victims as Capt. Roman Lachcik and Sub Lt. Jozef Racz.

PAP said Radio Free Europe balloon launchings had been "markedly intensified" in early August and "caused serious menace to the safety of air navigation in Poland."

It said the responsibility must be borne equally by the West German government which provides launching sites and "favors and supports this campaign" and the United States which "exercises direct and indirect control over the organizations."

A slowing up of lumber sales and a high inventory are contributing factors to the cut-back Kuhn said.

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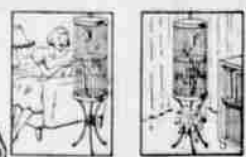
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
