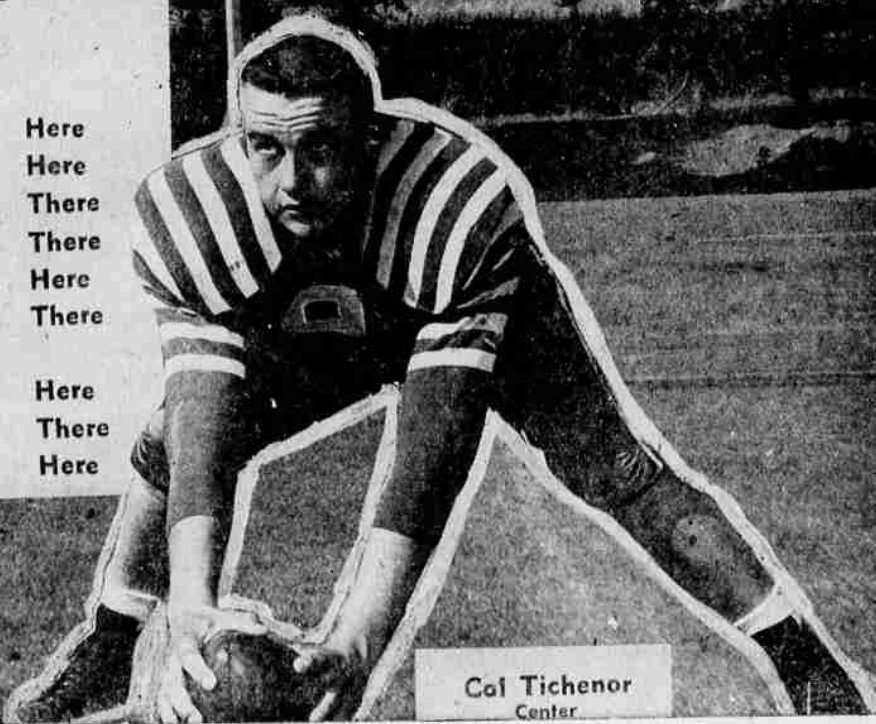

Coast Conference Gridgers Scrimmage; Oregon, OSC Camps Report Bright Days

Pacific Coast football players got around to leathering each other Thursday with scrimmages in all directions.

Nub Beamer, a sophomore fullback from Roseburg, scored four of the varsity's 10 touchdowns in a workout at Oregon State, moving 60 yards for one.

At Washington State, Bob Newman crossed the chalk lines twice as Coach Jim Sutherland's first team trimmed the second, 3-2, in touchdowns. Sutherland remarked his club "likes to play rough" and noted a number of bruises and stiff muscles.

Chuck Taylor declared himself "well satisfied" with the progress at Stanford and said he would have his first all-out scrimmage Saturday. Two of his men have minor

leg injuries, halfback Al Harrington and guard Don Manoukian. Lynn (Pappy) Waldorf at California sized up his team's scrimmage: "We have weight but we're looking for mobility."

UCLA scrimmaged half an hour at the end of a four-hour workout. Red Sanders used his midget backfield, including Doug Bradley, 172 pounds; Chuck Holloway, 162, and Barry Billingham, 170.

At Southern Cal, Jess Hill said he would decide after a Saturday scrimmage in which five games his seniors would play. The Trojans were penalized for under-the-table aid to athletes.

Jon Arnett missed drills at Troy because of sacroiliac trouble.

Len Casanova at Oregon was pleased by four hefty rookie tackles, all between 200 and 225 pounds. He has two veteran starters in John Raventos and Chuck Austin and liked the work of Tom Hale, Jim Linden, Ralph Marks and Bob Grottkan.

Skip Stahley thinks he has a good one at Idaho in Ken Hall, a sophomore fullback who can run the 100 in 16 flat. Hall weighs 192 and stands 5-8, causing Stahley to say he has "such a low center of gravity, he'll be hard to bring down."

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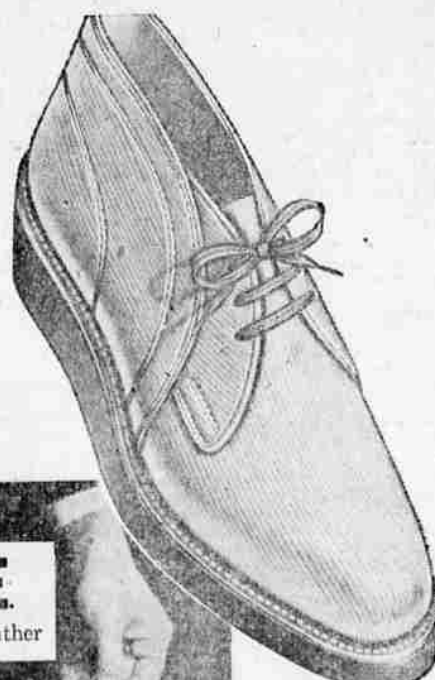
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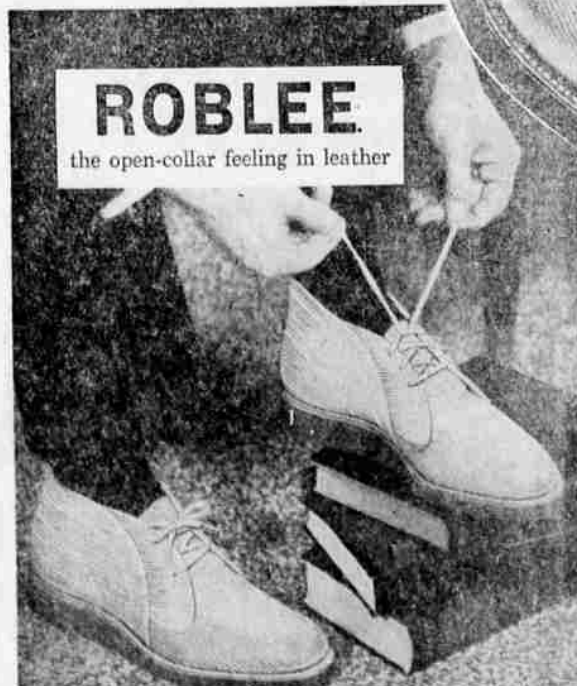
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
