

Ike Accused Of Failure In U.S. School Crisis

LIBERTYVILLE, Ill. (AP)—Adlai E. Stevenson accused the Eisenhower administration today of failing to meet the school crisis. He listed this as a major campaign issue and said the Democrats "are going to hit it often and hard."

Back at his home base after a fast political foray into California, the Democratic presidential nominee said his own party has a good program for meeting the school crisis, whereas the administration has done nothing in three and a half years but hold a fact-finding conference.

"We already know the facts," Stevenson said. "Our need is not for facts but action on the facts. . . . It is not only the future of our children that is at stake, it is the future of America itself."

Stevenson spoke up in a formal statement keyed to the trek of children back to the classrooms and to the political trips and conferences that have kept him on the go for nearly two weeks.

Today Stevenson was speechless—not a talk on tap until tomorrow. Then he moves down to Springfield, Ill., where he served a term as governor, over to Columbus to address the Ohio Democratic Convention, and on to New York.

Next week he and his vice presidential teammate, Sen. Estes Kefauver of Tennessee, will close out a series of regional conferences in meetings in Hartford, Conn., and New York with Democratic leaders from the New England and Middle Atlantic States.

They already have held six such conferences with party spokesmen from 35 states—the last in San Francisco Wednesday.

In the last 11 days, Stevenson has averaged around 1,000 miles a day by air and perhaps 50 on the ground.

Demos Invite Joe Smith

HARRISBURG, Pa. (AP)—Mythical Joe Smith, Vice President Nixon's only opposition for renomination, has been invited to the Democrat's campaign kick-off in Pennsylvania next Thursday.

The invitation came from Matthew H. McCloskey, national chairman of the Democratic Finance Committee. He said:

"You, Joe Smith, have become the symbolic figure of lost Republican hopes. You are Custer's Last Stand, the pride of Mudville at the end of the ninth inning and the family black sheep, all rolled into one defenseless fall guy. We need you."

Adlai Stevenson is scheduled to deliver his first major television address of the campaign at the fund-raising dinner.

Smith's name was placed in nomination at the Republican convention by Terry Carpenter, a delegate from Nebraska. He said he did so to show that the convention was open.

Show Tickets Now On Sale

Tickets for the Bing Crosby-Phil Harris benefit show for the Mayers' Memorial Hospital will be picked up Thursday, it is reported by Jim McDonald of the show promotion staff.

Tickets are still on sale at Bud and Charlotte's and the Derby Music Store in Klamath Falls, the Sportsman Hotel in Tulelake, and the Merrill Drug store. The show will begin at 1 p.m., Sunday, September 16.

McDonald points out that the hospital, located near McArthur in Northern California, is expected to be completed by early November. Funds raised for the forthcoming show are expected to provide funds for doing the finishing work on the building and installing interior furnishings.

An estimated 5,000 persons are expected to attend the show.

Germans Ask Big Four Powers For Unity Plan

BONN, Germany (AP)—Chancellor Adenauer's government called on the Big Four powers Friday to start new negotiations to unite divided Germany's 70 million people through free elections.

Sweeping security guarantees were offered to the Soviet Union to insure that it would never again be the victim of German aggression.

In notes to the United States, Britain, France and Russia, the Bonn Republic suggested the four Big powers should seek through normal diplomatic channels to develop an agreement with West Germany that would insure the success of a later conference on the whole German question.

The note to Russia was accompanied by a five-page memorandum outlining the Adenauer government's views on how Germany can be united without endangering Soviet security. Copies of the memorandum were sent to the Western Big Three.

The memorandum said the Big Four—which partitioned Germany between western and eastern blocs in 1945—bear the full responsibility for uniting the nation.

It described as a misunderstanding the contention of the Russians that a united Germany would be tied to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) and the West European Union (WEU).

Germany, when united, would have full freedom of decision on its future alliances, the document said.

If a united Germany should decide to remain in NATO, the security requirements of Russia could be met by creating a demilitarized zone in this sensitive heartland of the continent, it said.

The memorandum pointed out British Prime Minister Eden advanced the demilitarization idea at the Geneva conference last year.

This zone presumably would straddle a reunified Germany's frontiers with Communist Poland and Czechoslovakia.

West Germany likewise proposed that a disarmament agreement should be discussed "hand in hand" with German unification.

Nixon Funeral Held Today

WHITTIER, Calif. (AP)—Funeral services were conducted today for Frank Nixon, father of Vice President Richard M. Nixon. He died Tuesday at 77.

Attending the services at 2 p.m. PDT in the East Whittier Friends Church were the vice president, his wife, Pat, and other members of the immediate family.

The family has asked that, instead of sending flowers, friends make contributions to the Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation of New York City. The vice president's father suffered from arthritis in his later years.
