KF Air Base Commander Speaks To Soroptimists

"If you think the life we live in this country is worth preserving, you must be willing to make sacrifices to keep it," declared Col. S. C. Grashio, commander of the 408th Fighter Interceptor Group stationed at the Klamath Falls air base, speaking at the Thursday noon luncheon of the Soroptimist Club at the Winema Hotel.

Among the sacrifices that Klamath residents will be called upon to make will be putting up with the noise made by jet fighter planes when the local base reaches full strength, the commander stated.

"On a winter night when you are wakened at 3 a.m. by the noise of a jet in the air, remember you are safe in a warm bed," he counseled, "while that lad is up there in the soup, probably heading out to the Pacific to have a look-see at some craft that must be identified in order to protect you."

Col. Grashio complimented Klamath Falls on the friendly reception afforded military personnel who have been moved here in explaining air defense, he said that men will be on 24-hour duty, ready at a moment's notice to take off to identify or intercept any unknown craft that is spotted by radar in the area.
