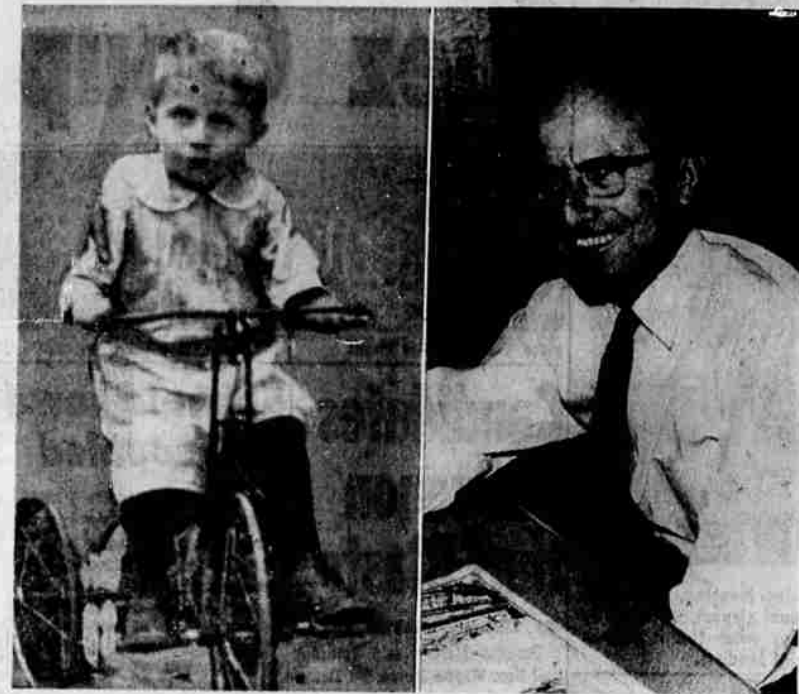

Gulliver was quite a traveler but if he had been a bellhop or caddy instead of a mariner, he probably would have gotten around even more.

This has been demonstrated by the career of Walter Farren, bell captain at the Willard-Hotel. Farren spent most of his life lugging golf bags and luggage for the world's big shots. His labors took

him hither and yon from coast to coast and border to border.

Farren, who has worked at the country's best hotels and golf courses, met and served a flock of celebrities. But the personage who made the most lasting impression on him was not a king, duke or a movie star. It was a character who called himself "Public Enemy No. 7."

Farren was born in Verona, Pennsylvania, March 20, 1910. He quit school after going through the sixth grade. His first job was working in a tool mill where his father was also employed.

Later Farren obtained a job at the Oakmont Country Club which boasts America's No. 5 golf course. In succeeding years he served as a caddy at golf courses in Arizona, Florida and California.

New Balloon Record Set

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — University of Minnesota scientists claimed a balloon record Friday, by nearly 20,000 feet. A plastic bag they sent up soared 142,900 feet, or more than 27 miles.

The record was set by a pyramidal-shaped balloon 180 feet long. It was constructed of mylar, a new plastic, and its skin, one-thousandth of an inch thick, held a million cubic feet of helium.

Edward P. Ney and John R. Winckler, university physicists working under the office of Naval Research, said the balloon carried 45 pounds of instruments, cameras, ballast and timers.

"After they had been up in the suite for a couple of hours," Farren continued, "they called down for a bowl of ice. When I went up with it, I saw they had killed the best part of two fifths of whiskey. The boss hands me a \$50 bill and says he wants to talk to me."

"We go into the bedroom. He closed the door and then addressed me as follows: 'Listen, Mac, and get this straight, I'm big time stuff. The next time I check in this joint, I want you to roll out the red carpet just like I am the King of Siam. I going to tell you something else, and if you holler copper, I'm going to cut your ears off. I'm Public Enemy No. 7.'"

Farren said he made a quick exit from the suite.

"I figured the guy was some small time hoodlum who probably held up a few corner grocery stores," Farren explained. "Shortly before daylight the next morning"

Ney said the experiments are being carried out to study cosmic rays and meteorology in the upper atmosphere.

Farren is a bachelor. Asked how he managed to escape matrimony, he said:

"From the number of divorces I read about in the newspapers, I believe it is better to have loved and lost—much better."
