Zeke Wins Trial Open Test



"WHAT ABOUT IT BOSS, YOU COULDN'T ASK for a much better job than ol' Zeke turned in — now couldja?" That's just about what Hal's Spi-wise Zeke seems to be saying to his master, Hal Shidler of Klamath Falls, after the big Lab came through Sunday and won the Open All Age Stake of the Shasta Cascade Retriever Club's annual fall trials. After getting off to a rather slow first series, the veteran performer went through the rest of the trial in masterful fashion to top the field of 33 entries in the open event. Zeke put the lid on the meet in the final series when he took a dead line on his single fall and picked the bird up in a manner suggesting built-in radar.

Hal's Spi-Wise-Zeke, a male Labrador, owned and handled by Hal Shidler of Klamath Falls, was judged top dog in the Open All-Age Stake of the Shasta Cascade Retriever Club's annual fall trial Sunday afternoon at the Earl Kerns Ranch 10 miles west of here.

SH Trounces St. Mary's

The Sacred Heart Academy grid squad of Klamath Falls launched the season Saturday night with a 13 to 7 win over the St. Mary's 11 in Medford on the 'apple valley' field. The Klamath Falls 11 put on the clincher with just five minutes remaining in the final stanza when Dean Michaels went around end for seven yards and the counter. Sacred Heart opened the scoring in the first stanza when he culminated a march with a scoring plunge from the 1-yard line. St. Mary's came through with their counter in the second quarter when Ed Fogel put the lid on a 60-yard march when he went off tackle for 15 yards and the score. Ron Pruitt ran the conversion and put the Medford chargers out in front 7-6.

On the statistics side of the game, St. Mary's had 14 first downs to 8 for the invaders, and had a combined yardage of 263, compared with 170 for Sacred Heart. St. Mary's was moved back 95 yards via the penalty route, with Sacred Heart being tapped 15 yards by the officials.

MAYS LANDING, N.J. (UP)—Pieces-Of-Eight won the \$30,175 Boardwalk Handicap at Atlantic City.

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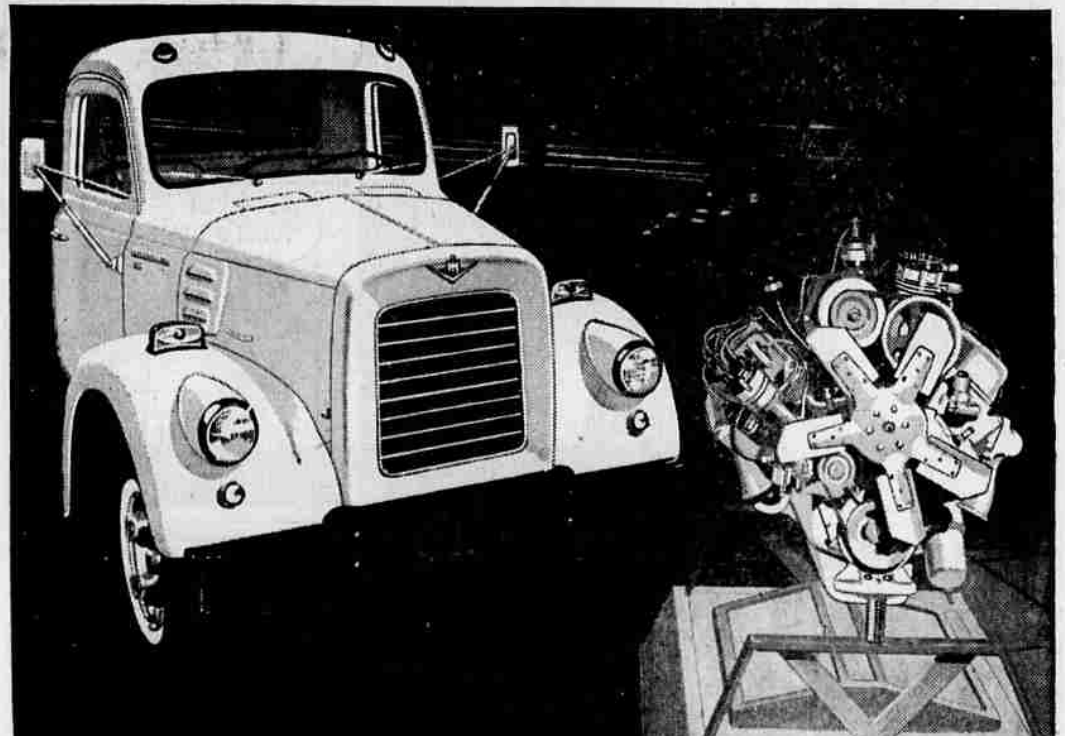
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
