Hatchery Bids Given

MOUNT SHASTA — Bingham Construction Company of Sacramento was awarded the contract for improvements and additions to the California Fish Hatchery in Mount Shasta. Amount of the bid was \$48,000.

Improvements are expected to be completed by late fall or early spring. Eight brood stock ponds and adjoining sorting and spawning houses will complete around out the pond systems allowing egg production to be increased.

The hatchery, which has been in operation since 1888, hatches more than eight million eggs annually, about half of which are shipped to other California hatcheries. It raises more than four million rainbow trout fingerlings, the greatest number raised by any California hatchery. Three million salmon fingerlings were hatched here and released in the Klamath River last year. In addition, more than 400,000 legal size rainbow trout were raised here.

Work on the project commenced this week with hopes of continuing good weather which would allow the work to be completed by early winter.

Summer Lake Lodge Ready

SUMMER LAKE — Extensive remodeling is nearly completed at Summer Lake Lodge. The lodge and new trailer court are expected to be in readiness for the influx of hunters when the season starts.

Frank Graves built the lodge in 1945 and has operated it continuously since that time with the exception of last year when it was leased. Upon resuming operation this year, he added the trailer court and a new 9 by 12-foot cooler to house meats and vegetables for the restaurant part of the operation. Fire Wipes Out Jap City Center

UOZU, Japan — More than 1,750 homes were destroyed today by a fire that virtually wiped out the center of this city of 47,000 persons 150 miles west of Tokyo. A typhoon wind of 30 m.p.h. fanned the flames.

Police said 1 person was killed, 22 were missing and 55 were injured. Firemen fought the blaze six hours before bringing it under control.

More than 8,000 persons were left homeless. Authorities estimated damages at \$4,150,000.
