The instrumental program in the elementary schools of Klamath Falls got underway last week with classes in intermediate and advanced, announced Andrew Loney Jr., city director of music education, today.

Instruction is being offered on violin, viola, cello, string bass, cornet, trumpet, clarinet, flute, saxophone, oboe, bassoon, french horn, alto horn, melophone, trombone, baritone, bass, and drums.

School District No. 1 provides the specialists in various fields of and percussion, Loney said.

The classes meet, in most instances, twice a week for 45 minute periods. Parents are being urged by Loney to obtain instruments for their children so that if possible they can begin instruction this week. The large and unusual instruments are available in limited quantities and will be loaned by the school district to those students indicating aptitude for the particular instrument.

Instrumental instructors in the grade schools are LaMar Jensen, Donald McKenzie, Stephen Stone, Kristian Gippo and Russell Whalen.

Police To Get Autopsy Report

HAMDEN, Conn. (UP)—Police expected today to receive the full FBI autopsy report on the vital organs of kidnaped and slain Cynthia Ruetola.

They held out little hope the report would indicate the cause and time of the child's death.

State's Attorney Abraham S. Ullman said a preliminary report received Tuesday from the FBI in Washington "points a finger at no one." The report failed to divulge when and how the 6-week-old child died, he said.

Basin Farmers Join In National Defense Week

Farmers in the Klamath Basin Area are observing the first National Civil Defense Week from September 9 to 15. A 30 minute recording of rural civil defense ideas as voiced by Federal Civil Defense Administrator Val Peterson, Under Secretary of Agriculture True D. Morse, and the leaders of the nation's four leading farm organizations will be played over radio stations KFLW and KFJL from 7:30 p.m. to 8 p.m. on Thursday.

Similar broadcasts are scheduled throughout the nation. The recording was sent by FCDA to some 3,200 county agricultural agents.

Participating in making the record with Peterson and Morse were Herschel Newsum, master of the National Guard; Charles B. Shuman, president of the American Farm Bureau Federation; James G. Patton, president of the National Farmers' Union and Homer L. Brinkley, executive vice president of the National Council of Farm Cooperatives.

In his opening remarks on the record Peterson lists five points which he considers important to any rural civil defense program in the event of enemy attack. These are assessment of threat, continued food production, ability to deliver food in edible form where needed, reception area care of evacuees and rescue as well as rehabilitation of attack areas.

John McDonald, president of the National Association of TV and Radio Farm Directors, moderates the recorded program. In the course
