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Parade Highlights Annual Italian Carnivale In Weed

WEED—Nearly 5,000 spectators lined Main Street Sunday for the Italian Carnivale parade of 50 decorated floats, second going to units from Siskiyou County and Southern Oregon which highlighted the two-day fourth annual celebration sponsored by the chamber of commerce.

Queen Gezelde DelGallo of Weed was crowned at the Coronation Ball Saturday night at the Hippodrome. Queen Gezelde and Spaghetti King Luzzi of 1955 and queen contestants Jeanette Morris of Weed and Carol Gil and Lois Ahlstrom of McCloud appeared on a special float in the parade.

"Jerrie" the clown, of Redding KVIP-TV, was crowned Spaghetti King of 1956. He ate the two pounds of spaghetti in three minutes to win over the other seven contestants. The \$25 prize was won by Robert "Hojos" Gonzales in the Mostaccio contest.

The Siskiyou Wonderland Accordion Band took first for the best Italian theme first award, and the entry of Our Lady of Guadalupe Society. Marching unit winners were Headliners Drum and Bugle Corps of the American Legion Post No. 8 of Klamath Falls, first, and the Weed Elementary School Band, second. The best decorated auto entry was that of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.
