

Ike To Stress Hopes Of Administration In Future

GETTYSBURG, Pa. (AP)—President Eisenhower apparently intends to lay stress on his administration's hopes for the future while leaving to Vice President Nixon any direct swings at the Democratic opposition.

That pattern for Republican campaigning was laid out here yesterday at a clover pasture rally of about 500 GOP leaders on Eisenhower's farm estate.

Eisenhower, who said "I feel fine" and looked it in country square garb of sports coat and slacks, told the picketing Republicans their first order of business is to get everybody registered and to the polls on election day.

He feels so nonpartisan about that, he said, that even if the Republicans couldn't convert all the

new voters "I'd rather they voted against us than not at all."

Without a word of direct criticism of the Democrats, Eisenhower urged the GOP workers to campaign in every section of the country to make sure that "we stay on the straight road of prosperity, progress and peace."

He urged the GOP workers to

"change a campaign into a crusade" and predicted November victory if there is enough hard work. "Don't let our people down by writing off as hopeless any constituency," he said. "This is the road to statehood or to defeat."

He exhorted his hearers to campaign on the theme that the GOP is "best fitted for management of our government."

Nixon, in a preview of the 32-state campaign tour he will begin next Tuesday, told the Republicans: "You don't win elections on a diet of dishwasher and milk toast."

He made it plain he will aim plenty of ammunition at Adlai

Stevenson, the Democratic presidential nominee, Sen. Estes Kefauver, his running mate, and former President Harry S. Truman.

Nixon challenged Stevenson to repudiate a statement by Truman that Truman does not believe Alger Hiss was a spy. Hiss, a former State Department employe, served a prison term for perjury growing

out of his denial that he passed secret government papers to a Russian spy ring.

Nixon said that if Stevenson doesn't disown Truman's statement, "we shall have to discuss this issue and let people decide whether we or our opponents are better qualified to handle this problem."

Democrats have complained that Nixon swung some low blows at them in the 1954 congressional campaign by insinuating their party was soft on communism.

Nixon assailed Stevenson's contention that the Eisenhower administration has been guilty of "misconduct and corruption."

Chief Speaks On Safety

"Most folks don't realize," advises Suburban Fire Chief M. G. Gordon, "that the fire department spends much of its time making careful inspections and in other fire prevention activities . . . much more time by far than it ever spends responding to alarms and actually fighting fires."

Today's fireman, adds the chief, is not only a fire fighter, he's equally skilled as a fire preventer.

"We hope more people here in the Klamath Basin will take advantage of the fire department's fire prevention training," he said. "It's for their own safety and they can easily do so simply by supporting the department's home inspection program."

He pointed out that a fireman can spot serious fire dangers which would ordinarily not be recognized as such by the average home owner.

The International Association of Fire Chiefs is sponsoring the campaign to have home inspection programs by all departments. It is the contention of the association that the U.S. toll of 6,000 home fire deaths annually would be cut in half if persons would have the firemen inspect their homes regularly.

"Why not do it now," advises the chief, "just dial TU 4-7745 and one of our firemen will obligingly visit your home for inspection purposes."

Authorities Seek Convicts

RAWLINS, Wyo. (UP)—Police set up roadblocks today for three "dangerous" criminals who escaped Wednesday night from the Wyoming State Penitentiary "bull pen."

Authorities in Wyoming, Utah, Colorado, Idaho and Nebraska were alerted to be on the lookout for the three men who sawed through bars on a window of the bull pen and sealed an outer wall with rope and hook to escape.

The escapers were identified as Arlen Sheriff, 27, and Harry Arnold, 31, both serving 18-year terms for assault and battery, and Royal Nester, 36, serving four to five years for grand larceny.
