Boy Reared As A Chicken

BELFAST, Northern Ireland — Police discovered Thursday a boy — apparently about seven — who they said has never bathed, cannot eat human food, who grunts like an animal and roosts like a chicken.

Sgt. Hugh Ross said the "pitiful little boy" was found in a henhouse at Down Patrick, County Down, 15 miles from Belfast. He has been taken to a home in Belfast and turned over to a team of physicians for examination.

Sgt. Ross said a group of children playing "hide and seek" ran into the hen house which adjoins a cottage occupied by a widow and her two grown daughters. The children found the boy perched on a roost with the hens and roosters.

INDIANS GET MONEY WASHINGTON — Indians received a record 41 million dollars from oil and gas leasing of their lands in the year ended June 30. Secretary of the Interior Seaton said this compared with 26 million dollars in 1954-55 and 13 million in 1950-51.

Disbar Rule Before Court

SALEM — The Oregon Supreme Court was asked Wednesday to disbar permanently three attorneys.

The board of directors of the State Bar made the request, naming attorneys Elmer G. Baldwin, Roseburg; David C. Pickett and L. B. Sandblast, both of Portland. Each has the right of appeal.

Baldwin is in the penitentiary for embezzling funds of an estate. Pickett is accused of collecting \$650 for a client and failing to turn the money over to her.

Sandblast, who was a candidate for state Supreme Court justice in the May primary, is accused by the Bar directors of having represented conflicting interests in the handling of an estate, and of purchasing property against a client's wishes.

Sandblast was defeated in the election by Justice Hall S. Lusk.

Court Studies Murder Appeal

SALEM — An appeal of a woman sentenced to life imprisonment for second-degree murder went before the Oregon Supreme Court Wednesday.

Attorney representing Mrs. Ann Whitney Avant told the court the conviction should be reversed on the grounds of prejudicial testimony, improper jury instruction and insufficient evidence.

Mrs. Avant, 49, was convicted of a fatally shooting Delmore Lessard prominent Portland attorney, in Heppner cafe in which she was employed, on June 4, 1935.

Lessard had gone to the cafe to discuss the education of one of his woman's two children. She had been divorced two years previously by Lessard represented Mrs. Avant's former husband.
