Kerron Cites Trailer Law

Dr. S. M. Kerron, Klamath County health officer, announced today that promiscuous trailer house parking is increasing at a rapid rate in Klamath County and especially so in the southern part of the county.

1. An adequate and safe water supply.
2. Adequate sewage disposal either by approved septic tank installation or connection to a municipal sewerage system.
3. Approved garbage storage, collection and disposal.
4. Approved utility building with adequate toilets, baths, lavatories and laundry facilities.
5. Adequate space for each trailer and proper supervision of the trailer park.

Dr. Kerron pointed out that it is a violation of the law for anyone to allow occupied trailers to park on their property without first getting a certificate of sanitation. Violation of any provisions of ORS 446, or the rules and regulations set up thereunder, is punishable by a fine of \$300 or 60 days imprisonment in the county jail, or both. Application for a certificate of sanitation must be made to the Klamath County Health Department, 194 Main Street, Klamath Falls.

ALAMOGORDO, N.M. (UP)—Two planes taking off simultaneously collided at the municipal airport here Thursday night killing two persons, one of them a former German air force officer who flew the first Nazi experimental rocket plane.

The former German pilot, Heinrich Lau, about 40, was employed at the super secret Holloman Air Development Center near here, presumably as a test pilot.
