

Airlines Stop Reserve Plan

WASHINGTON (UP) — From now on it's strictly "pay in advance" if you want a seat held for you on commercial airline flights.

The airlines have had their fill of persons who reserve seats and never pick them up. One airline counted 20,000 reserved but unused seats in one week.

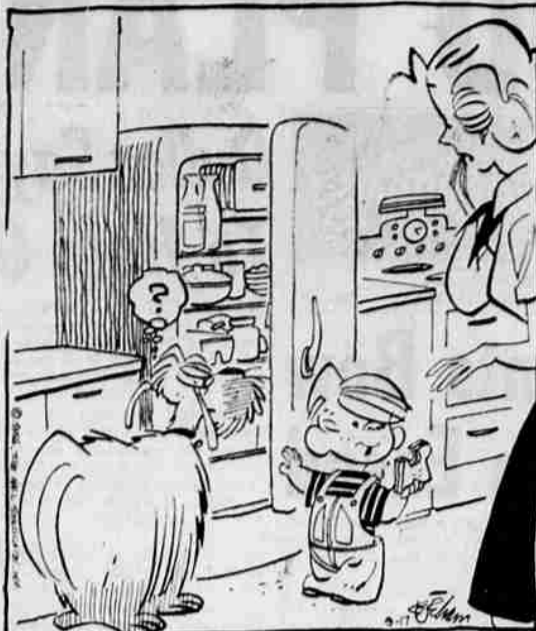
New methods have been devised to make it easier for a passenger to pay for a reserved seat ahead of time including drugstore pickup locations, a bank deposit arrangement, mail and teletype orders.

The new rule, which went into effect Sunday, applies to scheduled airlines which operate within the United States and between this country and its territories. This system already is used on airlines which fly between this country and foreign points.

District Attorney Plans Charges In Kidnaping Case

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (AP)— District Atty. Don Keller said he planned to issue criminal complaints today against two women who, says, snatched and buried her alive and naked.

The accused are Mrs. Victoria Winn, 57, who is involved in court litigation over business matters with Mrs. Latham, and Mrs. Lu-

ella Whisenand, 56, U.S. Customs Service clerk. Police arrested them Friday shortly after Mrs. Latham, 51, was found crouching behind a bush alongside U.S. Highway 80, twenty miles west of El Centro.

The district attorney interviewed Mrs. Latham for 90 minutes yesterday at a hospital. He said several crimes appeared to be involved. Mrs. Latham, wife of George Latham, investment broker, and an official of several of their corporations, said she was kidnaped from her home Wednesday. She repeated to Keller her ac-

count of being forced to sign checks. She said she was beaten, stripped, bound and blindfolded, then buried alive beneath rocks in a shallow desert grave.

The blindfold slipped, allowing her to see her kidnapers, she said. She struggled free and then walked and crawled five miles in blazing 110 degree heat. Friday night she reached a highway. She shielded her body with brush.
