

False Check Charge Made

An alleged spurious penman, whom police say was equipped with a check writing machine and a kit containing blank checks, ink eradicator and other items, asked for time to consult an attorney when arraigned Monday before District Judge D. E. Van Vactor.

The reputed bogus check passer, Richard Dale Wright, 24, railroad fireman, is accused of passing a worthless check for \$20 at the Valley Hotel. The complaint against him was signed by Ethel Olson, an employee of the hotel.

Wright was arrested in a drive-in cafe by city police at the request of the sheriff's office. According to Deputy Sheriff Dale Mattoon, the check writing machine and other equipment were found in the trunk of Wright's automobile.

Mattoon said several "practice" checks were also found. One of these checks was made out on the "First National Bank, Your City" in the amount of \$395.00.

District Attorney Richard Beesley said he is holding three other bad checks which he said were passed by Wright.

Judge Van Vactor set the defendant's bail at \$3,000 and remanded him to the county jail.

Red Missile Threat Cited

WASHINGTON (UP)—A top Navy official says that Russia's big fleet of missile carrying submarines poses a "majoraval threat" to the U.S. mainland.

Assistant Navy Secretary Harrison Norton also said the long range Soviet submarines are capable of operating in the waters of the world "which are of military importance to the United States." They are "a serious threat," he said, to this country's "sea lanes of communication."

Vice Adm. T. S. Cowe, deputy chief of naval operations, agreed that Russia has greatly increased its "undersea warfare capability." But he said the American Navy "can defeat any Soviet submarine threat."

Norton and Cowe appeared Sunday night on the second broadcast of the American Legion's radio series, "Survival in the Air Age."

Nixon Speech Hits Snag

The hour of Vice President Nixon's Wednesday evening speech at Eugene has been snagged by conflict: President Eisenhower will give a nationally televised address that same evening.

Bob Mau, Republican national committeeman, said Monday morning that a solution was only hours away but that this was the problem:

While the President's speech if carried 'live' would end before the Eugene meeting started, a Portland station (KOIN-TV) whose signal is received in the Eugene area, plans to present it at 8:30 p.m., just about the time Nixon had been scheduled.

The decision, Mautz said, may be: 1. go ahead without reference to the President's address and hope only a few people stay away from the Nixon meeting to view it; 2. arrange for television reception of the President's speech at McArthur Court; 3. change Nixon's speech hour.

If the McArthur Court meeting audience sees a relay of the President's speech, Mautz said, Nixon's speech will have to come first since protocol requires that the President's final speaker.

Death Takes Funk Sexton

Frank X. Sexton, 66, died in a San hospital September 13 following a long illness.

He had served as chief clerk to a superintendent of the Great Northern Railway for 45 years, in that capacity in Klamath Falls since May 1, 1928 until his retirement August 31, 1955. Following his retirement due to ill health, he moved with Mrs. Sexton to Los Gatos, California.

He was a member of the 4th Degree, Knights of Columbus and of Sacred Heart Catholic Church, this city and a graduate of Gonzaga University, Spokane.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Margaret Sexton, Los Gatos, three daughters, Mrs. Patricia Bisell, Mary Louise and Marianne.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday morning at St. Aloysius Church, Spokane. Final rites and interment will follow in Holy Cross Cemetery in that city.

Prospector Found Dead

COEUR D'ALENE, Idaho (UP)—The body of a 40-year-old Spokane prospector, Ed Koski, a bullet wound in his head, was found in his isolated cabin on Beauty Creek, 14 miles southeast of here, Saturday night.

Sheriff H. H. Haner said it was a case of murder and robbery. Missing from the one-room cabin, Haner said, were two rifles, a wallet containing about \$100, a Geiger counter and other personal effects. Koski's car also was gone.

Koski's body was found by officers sent to find him after the prospector failed to keep an appointment here.

Haner said officers are looking for a man for questioning in connection with Koski's slaying.

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Negro-Education Report Given

WASHINGTON (UP)—A Villanova University psychologist said Monday that as measured by psychological-test performance Negroes as a group do not possess as much capacity for education as do white people.

Dr. Frank C. J. McGurk, associate professor of psychology at Villanova, added:

"This has been demonstrated over and over."

In a copyrighted article in U.S. News & World Report, weekly news magazine published in Washington, the psychologist said the nation "will have to be more factual about race differences, and much less emotional."

McGurk said he based his conclusions on psychological tests administered to whites and Negroes during World War I and since.

High Fashion Originals Vanish; Piracy Whispered

NEW YORK (UP)—Couturiers whispered of fashion piracy today in the disappearance of high fashion originals here and in Kansas City, Mo.

New York designer Pauline Trigere revealed Sunday that almost her entire fall collection, valued at \$250,000 had disappeared from the municipal airport in Kansas City last Wednesday.

Branel, a New York dress house, said that four Christian Dior Paris originals valued at more than \$4,000 had disappeared

en route to them from the custom house.

A Branel spokesman said that neatly wrapped boxes believed to contain the four Dior creations valued at between \$1,000 and \$1,500 each had been delivered to them. But the boxes were empty when opened.

Miss Trigere, a Parisian designer, said she had not revealed her loss until Sunday under the advice of the FBI which has entered the case.

Five cases containing luxury gowns, suits and furs worth some

\$250,000, had been delivered to the air terminal by a truck driver from Woolf Brothers Department Store where they had been displayed in a fashion show Tuesday night.

The FBI said the truck driver told them he had placed the cases, each about 50 inches long and plainly marked with the designer's name, on a cart in the air cargo warehouse at the airport fashion show scheduled there Friday and then delivered the waybill to day.

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
