HOLLYWOOD (UP)—When NBC's "Wide World" decided to let the nation see how Hollywoodites spend their Sundays, one movie director at least gave an honest excuse when he ducked out of appearing on the show: "I sleep on Sundays."
 But the rest of this little village will be up bright and early Sept. 30 to show TV viewers what goes on around here on the day of "rest."
 Ernest Borgnine, Sheree North and Dan Dailey will be at Dailey's house where they'll break into a fast dance (from their next picture, of course). Viewers also will see Natalie Wood and Tab Hunter in a swimming pool during a "party" at director Mervyn LeRoy's house. In real life Natalie would be holding hands with Elvis Presley at a movie.
CAMERAS INVADE STUDIO
 NBC's cameras also will invade MGM studio, the first time a film factory has been seen "live" on TV. The sets will be closed as usual on Sunday, but MGM's good-will ambassador, George Murphy, will show viewers around the back lot and the sets.
 Other celebrities will "work" however for the show. MGM designer Helen Rose will stretch fashions in her "office"—reproduced at the NBC studio.

LAKEVIEW — An increase of 1,426 patrons at the Lakeview swimming pool was noted by Manager Stanley Tooker for 1956 over the 1955 season. The pool closed for the season September 9.
 This is the fifth year of operation of the community pool, built under the sponsorship of the Lakeview Lions Club. Receipts for this year totaled \$3,424.73, an increase of \$386.06 over the previous summer. The attendance included 1,373 adults, 2,522 high school students, 8,222 grade school students and 2,605 for lessons.
