### Estes Says Farm Food Stamp Plan 'Workable'

ST. PAUL, Minn. (AP)—Sen. Estes Kefauver said today a still secret report of the Agriculture Department shows that a food stamp plan, pledged by the Democrats in their platform, would be workable.

He said the study, ordered by Congress, also shows that the estimated cost of the plan "is considerably less" than the Eisenhower administration proposes to spend on its farm program next year.

"And what is more," the Democratic vice presidential candidate said in a statement, "the Eisenhower plan calls for us to plan under our 'surplus' instead of feeding it to our undernourished citizens."

Kefauver said the Democrats do not claim that a food stamp plan for channeling surplus farm products to needy citizens would be a

**Called**—to Ft. Collins, Colorado by the death of his father was Marvin Shell of Malin.

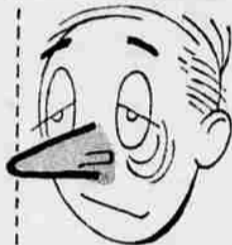
