Ten schools will participate in panel discussions, five each day, with Lakeview supplying secretaries to take notes and make transcripts to be distributed to each student attending.

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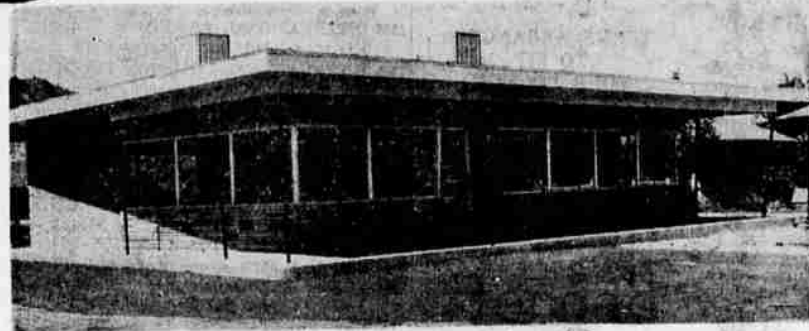
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
