Coon Reveals Business Meet

Congressman Sam Coon (R-Ore) revealed today that a meeting will be held in Portland on October 3 and 4 for small businessmen to outline the opportunities that exist for them in government contracts.

Sponsored by the Small Business Administration (SBA), the meeting is to show small businessmen what is purchased by the government and Armed Forces and assist them in getting on the proper bid mailing lists, said Coon.

It is one of a series of procurement conferences conducted by the SBA throughout the country. Small businessmen from Oregon and adjacent areas are invited to attend the two-day affair at the National Guard Armory.

"I have been told that top officials of the SBA and of all the military and civilian procuring agencies of the government will be present," said Coon. "Several million dollars worth of current bid invitations, specifications and drawings will be available for examination."

In addition, there will be an exhibit of many actual items being procured by government departments, Coon said.

"I urge all small businessmen to attend this meeting," Coon declared. "It will show them what opportunities exist for small business in this field of government purchases."

"This is a good example of the work that the SBA is doing to encourage and assist free enterprise. It has worked effectively to promote the interests of small business operators."

Cooperating with the SBA in arranging the meeting are the Portland Chamber of Commerce, Oregon Chamber Executives, Inc., Oregon Development Commission, and Columbia Empire Industries, Inc.

CRIMINALS PAROLED

TOKYO (AP) — The United States Wednesday paroled four more Japanese war criminals. Their release cut the number of war criminals still in prison to 171, 102 of them sentenced by the United States.

Other activities of the two day visit included taking part in a review of graduating recruit companies, attending scheduled luncheons with officer and enlisted personnel, viewing a whale boat race, and viewing the interiors of a submarine and an aircraft carrier at the nearby Navy pier.

"It was certainly an educational visit," added Carlson, "and I'm sure that continued tours of this nature for representatives from other states will be completely beneficial to all concerned."

Relative to the Navy recruiters working in the Klamath Basin area, Carlson commended the recruiting personnel working here, adding that they are in complete harmony with school officials and other residents of the area.
