And after losing 2-1 to Pittsburgh in 10 innings yesterday, even winning all their seven remaining games won't guarantee a thing for the Braves—who have been able to win as many as three in a row only once in the last two weeks. Even by winning all seven, Milwaukee can't gain as much as a tie for the pennant unless Brooklyn's world champion Dodgers lose two of their remaining nine. The Braves, beginning to hear the jingle of another world series payoff, have won nine of their last 11 and took a full-game lead while idle yesterday.
