



### Freedom Talk Heard By Club

Members of the Klamath Falls Knife and Fork Club heard an inspirational talk Thursday evening at their first dinner meeting of the season by a veteran Hollywood actress who stepped from behind the footlights to study America. The speaker was Betty Roadman who spoke on "An Actress Looks at America." She demonstrated a penetrating knowledge of world affairs.

It is Miss Roadman's contention that our first concern is not building up atomic defenses but preserving the spirit of freedom in the hearts of our people. "There's too much talk today about what's wrong with America," she said. "Many more things bind us together than separate us. Man has always known fear. The pioneers who came across the plains in covered wagons," she continued, "learned the Indians'

tomahawk. Now we fear the atomic bomb. If we maintain our real strength which lies in the hearts of our freedom-loving people, we have nothing to fear."
