Nixon Hurls Demo Blast

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (AP)—Vice President Nixon started the second week of a 13,000-mile campaign tour today by accusing the Democrats of stepping up "their campaign of misrepresentation and distortion."

He made the accusation as he headed for a noonday speech at Phoenix, Ariz., and a night rally at Salt Lake City after a weekend pause here in his current tour that started last Tuesday. He has visited 11 states.

Despite the Democrats' tactics, Nixon said, the Eisenhower administration intends to "rest its case with the voters on a full and truthful presentation of its record."

That record, he said, is one of peace, prosperity and progress and of elevation of "the whole moral tone of the federal government" during the past four years.

"This is one of the historic occasions in American political history when an administration welcomes the opportunity to rest its case with the voters on a full and truthful presentation of its record."

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San Francisco (UP)—Police Chief Frank Ahern has asked the supervisors to pass a law banning switchblade knives.

Ahern's request came as the result of a series of fights between some teen-agers at a high school football pageant at Kezar Stadium Friday.

Four youths were stabbed and six others injured. Two hundred and five policemen rushed to Kezar as the result of a riot call.

The Grand Jury planned to discuss the incident at its meeting tonight. Mayor George Christopher planned to discuss it, probably Tuesday, with Ahern, Dist. Atty. Thomas Lynch and school authorities.

Meanwhile, Supervisor Joseph Casey, chairman of the board's Police Committee, promised immediate action on Ahern's proposal to outlaw switchblades. He said he intends to call for a hearing on a proposed ordinance Oct. 9 or 10.

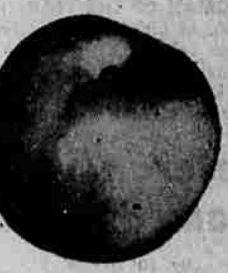
