Veteran School Teacher Named Woman Of Year

LAKEVIEW — National Business and Professional Women's Week, September 23 to 29, officially opened here with a Sunday morning breakfast at Van's honoring Lakeview's Woman of the Year, Laura Waterman, chosen by the Lakeview BPW Club. Following breakfast, club members attended the 11 a.m. services at the First Baptist Church. Arrangements were in charge of Mrs. Eva Arthur.

Miss Waterman was born at Greenwood, Illinois, but moved with her family to Idaho when she was 10 years old. She attended school at Moscow and received her degree at the University of Idaho there. Her major was psychology with a minor in history and mathematics, both of which she taught in her first years in Lakeview.

She has taught continuously in Lakeview High School since 1925. In the 10 years from 1938 to 1948, she was principal of the high school. Upon her resignation, she was persuaded to take the position of dean of girls which she still holds. Involved in this responsibility is sponsorship of the Girls' League, assisted by other teachers under an advisory system.

Her students and former students state without fear of contradiction that there has never been a student under her jurisdiction during her 31 years of teaching here who will ever forget her. Many are the visitors who make it a point to look her up when they return to visit.

"I am just beginning to realize that there are second generation students in my classrooms these days," Miss Waterman stated in reminiscing about her years here.

"In checking over the records recently, I thought I recognized the mother's name of a boy in my math class. Curiosity tempted me to ask him if she was the same girl I had taught some years ago and he hastened to assure me that it was so, but quickly added, 'But, Miss Waterman, I'm not half as smart as my mother was.'"

During the years, she has noted the increase in students in the high school from about 140 to the present average of 380. Coinciding with this is the growth in the number of teachers from a city school staff of about 15 to more than 30, and the construction of

four new school buildings and improvements made to others.

The curriculum has also broadened and she has noted a number of outstanding successful careers among former students who have gone on to bigger fields. She has broadened her own educational scope by acquiring her master's degree from Colorado and a trip to the Hawaiian Islands this past summer was a highlight of enjoyment during school vacations.

While not a member of the club which is now honoring her, she is a member of the Lakeview Sororist Club and a member and past president of the Lakeview branch of AAUW. Her home is well established through residence with the A. L. Thornton family for the last 24 years. She is a member of the First Presbyterian Church and has taught Sunday School classes there for many years.

"During my years as principal," stated Miss Waterman, "I can truthfully say that the cooperation I received from the parents was wonderful. Because of this, whenever a problem with a student arose and I said 'Let's call your parents in on this,' that was usually the end of the problem."

Because of vibrant personality, a trigger-quick mind, a sense of humor and a broad viewpoint which combines tolerance and an understanding of youthful joys and problems, Miss Waterman will never be placed in the category of the 'prim and prissy school-ma'am.'"

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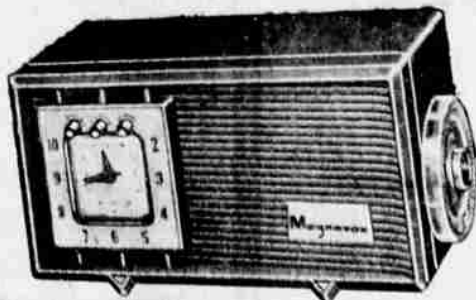
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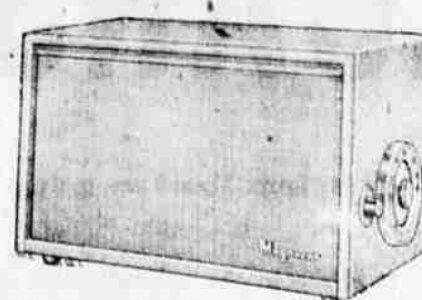
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
