Council Rejects Petition To Abandon Work Job

The Klamath Falls City Council last night rejected a petition designed to have the council abandon its proposed improvement project No. 132, calling for the improvement of portions of Siskiyou and Donald streets in the Buena Vista Addition.

The petitioners, some of whom were present at the meeting and who were represented by Attorney E. E. Driscoll, maintained that they represented ownership of approximately 40 per cent of the property within the bounds of the proposed improvement, and numerically represented 75 per cent of the persons who will be assessed to pay for the improvement. There were about eight land owning couples that signed the petition.

Driscoll maintained that in addition to the persons he represented, there were only three single lot owners unsigned, along with Norman Jones, the single property owner reported to own the majority of property within the area.

"To my line of reasoning," Driscoll added, "this would be assessing the majority of the property owners within the improvement project for something which would benefit only Mr. Jones." It was pointed out that Jones plans to improve the land and build homes within the area.

3. Authorized acceptance of the contract with the John W. Cunningham firm of Portland for working with the proposed sewage line extension and disposal plant construction in the east side area of the city. The firm will act as consulting engineers, prepare surveys, plans and specifications, and provide advisory and resident engineer personnel during the period of construction. The project is that approved by the voters when passing the \$800,000 sewage bond issue last spring.

4. Approved a new vacation and sick leave resolution relating to city employees. The new resolution will permit vacation to be pro-rated in some instances in the future, whereas no such provision was in the former resolution. In the future, an employee who has worked with the city for more than one year will be able to be paid for the vacation to which he is

entitled if leaving the city forces for reasons other than being unsatisfactory or by virtue of misconduct while a city employee.

HOUSTON (AP) — Three dimensional color television by 1975 is predicted by Ray Campbell, Western Division executive vice president of the Foote, Cone & Belding advertising firm. He also predicts by 1960 more than half of all television sets will be color.
