Shafer Freed Of Bomb Rap

SAN ANTONIO, Tex. (AP) — San Antonio labor leader Raymond C. Shafer was acquitted last night of charges connected with an attempted bombing of the Alamo Motor Freight Lines here Jan. 5, 1955.

The jury returned the verdict clearing Shafer of a charge of possessing a dynamite bomb on or about Jan. 5, 1955, at 10:45 p.m. Shafer, president and secretary of Teamsters Union Local 657, said he was "real happy."

Two state witnesses who linked Shafer to the attempted bombing during a labor dispute were arrested earlier yesterday.

Their testimony had implicated Shafer and themselves in the attempt.

The jury was ordered to consider only one charge against Shafer, possession of a dynamite bomb. He originally was charged also with aiding and abetting Owens to possess a bomb and with directing Owens to keep a bomb.

Owens testified that at Shafer's direction, he stole the dynamite used in the attempt, which failed, apparently because of a faulty fuse.

Shafer's defense brought to the stand several character witnesses and made several attempts to provide an alibi for his whereabouts during the time he was allegedly plotting the bombing attempt.

First Witness For Defense To Talk In Brinks Case

BOSTON (AP)—The first witness for the defense was scheduled to testify today in the trial of eight men charged with the \$1,219,000 Brink's robbery.

For four weeks, the prosecution, handled by Asst. Dist. Atty. Frederick T. Doyle, put on the record the testimony of 60 witnesses.

By far the most important witness for the state was Joseph J. (Specs) O'Keefe, 48, a dapper Boston hoodlum with a record of 70 arrests.

He pleaded guilty to the nation's biggest cash robbery and as a state's witness he told dramatically and in detail how the robbery was planned for about two years and how it was carried out by himself, the eight defendants and two others, who died of natural causes before they could be brought to trial.

On trial are Michael V. Geagan, 48; James I. Faherty, 45; Thomas F. Richardson, 49; Joseph F. McGinnis, 53; Henry Baker, 50; Adolph Maffie, 45; Vincent J. Costa, 42; and Anthony Pino, 49, all of the Boston area.

The 60th and final prosecution witness was FBI Agent John F. Kehoe Jr.

He told how he participated in the arrest of Faherty and Richardson — the last of the eight to be arrested — in a Dorchester district tenement last May 16.

He said Richardson ran into the bathroom "about a step in front of me." At the same time, he said, he "observed Faherty going for guns on a chair."

The FBI man said he spun Richardson one way and lunged at Faherty, knocking both off balance and overcoming them.

The prosecution put into evidence \$54,548 in bills it said were seized from Brink's.

PAINTER DIES

WILMINGTON, Del. (AP) — Theodore R. Cornwell, 80, a landscape painter who became best known for designing the seals for the Department of Justice, the Bureau of Fisheries and Hatcheries and for the American Heritage Foundation, and who was called out of retirement in 1947 to decorate the interior of the Freedom Train, died yesterday.
