## State Road Commission Heads For New Trouble

SALEM, Ore.—The Oregon Highway Commission seems headed for trouble in the Legislature as it gets ready to tackle the huge job of modernizing the state road system.

While it isn't unusual for the commission and the Legislature to be at odds, the conflict now seems more intense.

The commission, in planning a statewide road system, naturally steps on the toes of many local interests. When it bypasses a town, closes an access road, or doesn't pay a property owner what he thinks he should get for right-of-way, somebody gets mad.

The Legislature reflects these local interests, and its members some times make charges that the commission is arrogant and autocratic.

The Legislative Interim Highway Committee consists of the

men who will shape highway legislation in the 1957 session.

**TROUBLE BOILS**

What they are saying about the commission makes it look as though the commission will have trouble getting what it wants.

The commission wants 12 bills passed and asked the Interim Committee to sponsor them. The committee agreed to sponsor two of the most minor ones, but not the others.

In recommending that the three-man Highway Commission be increased to five members, the committee said it believes the enlarged commission would more adequately represent all interests in the state. That implies, of course, that the state's interests aren't being represented now.

There also is a recommendation that the commission "improve its public relations." The committee didn't get specific about that.

Rep. Robert L. Elstrom, Salem, an Interim Committee member, said "the commission now consists of two bankers and a business man. It needs a farmer on it."

**COLD SHOULDER**

Sen. Warren McMinimee, Tillamook, chairman of the committee, chimed in with a statement that "this commission can give you the coldest shoulder you ever received."

Then Rep. E. A. Littrell, Medford, suggested that the commission be limited to two terms of four years each. The other members said that would be a good idea for all state boards and commissions.

McMinimee claims that "the commission doesn't know what's going on in the state and in its own department. It delegates too much power to employees."

While the commission was asking for more authority under the new program, the committee members were almost unanimous that they wouldn't grant any more power to the commission.

In sarcastic vein, Elstrom said, "Let's abolish all other boards and commissions and let the Highway Commission run the whole state."

**DISPLEASURE**

Several members expressed displeasure that the commission had named the Portland-Salem Expressway recently resigned as state highway engineer. They pointed out that this was done shortly after several leading legislators and Gov. Elmo Smith proposed naming it after the late Gov. Paul Patterson.

At these Interim Committee meetings, the members spend lots of time talking about their local problems, but these pave the way for new legislation.

For instance, McMinimee was 10 minutes late to the last meeting because he got behind a slow driver on the highway west of Salem.

So McMinimee launched into a tirade against slow drivers. In a few minutes, the committee had agreed to sponsor legislation to prohibit slow driving.

**Defense Plans Brinks Strategy**

BOSTON (UP)—The defense planned to call more police witnesses today in an attempt to show conflicting testimony against eight men accused of the million-dollar Brink's robbery.

Official police records produced Wednesday apparently contradicted testimony of at least one prosecution witness.

Thomas B. Lloyd, chief cashier at Brink's and one of five employees who was bound and gagged during the Jan. 17, 1950 holdup, insisted early in the trial that he could not recall telling police bandits were all the same weight.

## Contempt Of Court Case Could Spur Color Group

TYLER, Tex. (AP)—A contempt of court case in Federal District Court today could give the National Assn. for the Advancement of Colored People fresh ammunition in its battle to integrate public schools.

And tomorrow in a Tyler state court, Texas will try to put the NAACP out of business in the state.

Dist. Judge Joe Sheehy presided at today's hearing. The suit was filed for the NAACP by U. Simpson Tate, Dallas Negro, regional attorney for the organization.

Tate is asking Judge Sheehy to allow the NAACP to file contempt of court charges against Dr. H. W. Stilwell, president of Texarkana, (Tex.) Junior College, and Bill Williams, a college trustee.
