

Kefauver Claims Demos To Save Small Business

BELLEVILLE, Ill. (AP) — Sen. Estes Kefauver said today the Democrats are pledged "to save the small farmer and the small businessman." He said the existence of both is threatened by the Eisenhower administration.

This was the message the Democratic vice-presidential candidate took with him as he set off for a 250-mile motorcade through 10 towns in southern Illinois, starting here.

Kefauver contended in his prepared speech for a rally in the courthouse square here that "the Eisenhower-Nixon administration has been indifferent to both the small farmer and the small businessman."

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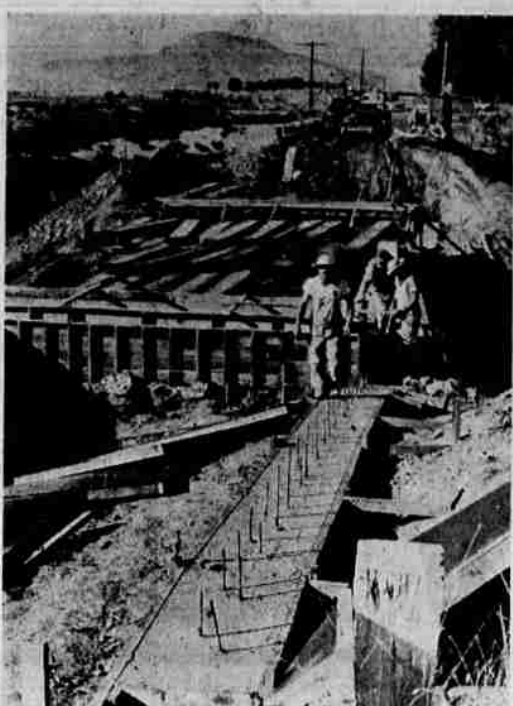

Smith Tells PTA Month

A recent proclamation by Governor Elmo Smith designates the month of October as Parent-Teacher Enrollment Month in Oregon.

The proclamation urges that all citizens of Oregon give serious consideration to the importance of cooperation in the education and training of the state's young people, as well as bringing the home and school into a clear relationship which will build still better American citizens.

The National Congress of Parents and Teachers, a volunteer organization formed in Washington, D.C. in 1896, last year had a membership of more than 10 million in more than 42,182 local units.

The Oregon Congress of the PTA attained an all time high last year with 123,134 members, a gain of 4,991 over the previous year. There were 661 local units in Oregon.

Legislators Study Reasons For Ill-Prepared Students

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. John Bell Williams (D-Miss.) indicated today he wants to determine why some Washington students are reaching high school without mastering reading and arithmetic.

Williams is a member of a House subcommittee investigating Washington's racially integrated schools.

Teachers and principals have testified that some students were promoted to junior and even senior high school although their mastery of basic subjects was as low as third or fourth grade level.

Badly unprepared students, witnesses said, came largely but not entirely from previously all-Negro schools.

Miss Leila Prince, 10th grade teacher at Eastern High School, showed the subcommittee some of her students' work yesterday. It included a spelling exercise in which were such examples as "beans" for "theft," "caence" for "receipt" and "pena" for "perceive."

Williams said in an interview "the people have a right to know" what produced such conditions. Williams declined to say whether
