Court Of Inquiry Eyes Texas Integration Suit

KENNEDALE, Tex. — Ten Webb and held here where Webb's office is located. M. T. Moody, president of the Mansfield branch of the National Assn. for the Advancement of Colored People, was one of the main witnesses. He testified that he knew L. Judge Joe Estes, who said the suit was premature. The ruling was reversed by the U.S. 5th Circuit Court of Appeals and returned to Estes. He then ordered the Mansfield school district to proceed with immediate integration.

Britain Sets Off A-Weapon

CANBERRA, Australia — Britain exploded an atomic weapon today at its new Maralinga proving ground in Australia. "Scientific records are being collected for accurate evaluation and all safety precautions are in operation," the announcement said. The Maralinga tests had been held up for several weeks because of bad weather. It is believed the devices being tested are destined to become warheads in guided weapons being developed in British factories and tested at Australia's Woomera rocket range, adjoining Maralinga. For the first time a group of American military observers witnessed a British atomic test.

AF Lifts B-52 Ground Ban

WASHINGTON — The nation's B-52 heavy bombers may take to the air again as rapidly as each plane passes a "rigid inspection" of the internal systems. The Air Force imposed that condition as it lifted a blanket order which had grounded all the big jet planes for more than a week. The grounding was ordered as a precautionary measure after one of the planes crashed Sept. 17 near Modera, Calif., killing five crew members.

Matusow To Hear Jail Sentence

NEW YORK — Turnabout witness Harvey M. Matusow, convicted of perjury in a Communist conspiracy case, faces a possible maximum sentence of 25 years in prison and \$10,000 fine. Matusow, 29-year-old former Communist who testified for the government in many conspiracy cases, will be sentenced tomorrow by U.S. Judge John F. C. McGohery. Matusow paled and slumped in his chair with his hands to his eyes as a federal court jury of 10 men and 2 women brought in its guilty verdict late yesterday after 90 minutes of deliberation. Defense counsel announced plans to appeal.

FIVE COUNTS
Matusow was convicted on five counts of perjury. The case developed from his recantation of the testimony he gave in a government trial of 12 second-string Communist leaders. After the jury found him guilty, the judge raised his bail from \$2,000 to \$10,000 but allowed him continued freedom until late today to raise the added bail. A vital point in Matusow's 10-day trial concerned his accusations against Roy M. Cohn, formerly an assistant U.S. attorney here and later chief counsel to the U.S. Senate investigating subcommittee when it was headed by Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy (R-Wis.). Matusow was charged with making false statements in a recanting affidavit he signed Jan. 21, 1955, and with repeating these falsehoods at hearings for the trial of the 12 Communists.

COHN DENIES
Matusow swore in the affidavit, and on the witness stand at his trial, that Department of Justice attorneys and FBI agents induced him to give false testimony against the Communist leaders. Matusow swore that Cohn, a prosecutor at the conspiracy trial, coached him to give false testimony. Cohn, now in private law practice, took the stand at Matusow's trial to deny this. Matusow, who once said he would do "anything for a buck," worked for years as an FBI informer and got on government payroll as an anti-Communist witness. He said that without any evidence he denounced 344 Americans as Communists or Red sympathizers.

Senator Gore Slates Probe Into Campaign Expenses

WASHINGTON — Sen. Gore (D-Tenn.) said today he plans to give the nation this year its first current picture of how much money is being spent in a national election campaign and where it is coming from. Gore, chairman of the Senate Elections subcommittee, told newsmen public hearings will be held in Washington set for Oct. 2, 9 and 10. National campaign committees of both parties and their subsidiaries will be asked to give a full accounting for the month of September, the period when they arrange much of their financing for the campaign.

Paul M. Butler and Leonard W. Hall, the respective Democratic and Republican national chairmen, are to appear Oct. 10. Both have been giving full cooperation, Gore said. Others asked to appear will be officials of Volunteers for Stevenson and Citizens for Eisenhower, of labor, business and youth groups set up by both parties, and of such independents as Americans for Democratic Action, Gore added.

Each group set up by the major parties is entitled to spend three million dollars in the campaign, the same legal limit that applies to a national committee. Gore said, "My tentative estimate is that approximately 1 per cent of the people provide about 98 per cent of the campaign funds. This appears to constitute a danger of popular government."

STATE VISIT
LONDON — Buckingham Palace announced Thursday Queen Elizabeth II and the Duke of Edinburgh will make a state visit to France from April 8 to April 11 next year. The queen — then Princess Elizabeth — and her husband last visited Paris in 1947.

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
