## Mrs. Alice Lamm Describes Tour To Soroptimists

"You have to have good shoes to keep on your feet on a four months tour of the world," Mrs. Alice Lamm told some 75 Soroptimists and their guests meeting for luncheon at the Winema Hotel on Thursday noon.

Such a tour has its ups and downs, Mrs. Lamm declared. The points of interest around the world are chiefly down steps and up hills and then up steps again, she commented.

"You want just one camel ride," she declared in telling of her stop at Aden in Arabia where the group saw a 125-camel caravan. Mrs. Lamm retired to their car while some of the party took camel rides in 124-degree heat. The previous day, the peak temperature had been 132 degrees, she said.

She told of her first elephant ride, however.

"The elephant kneels," she said, "and the passengers mount to a basket on his back by means of a ladder. The four passengers can hold on to a rod in front of the seats — and you need to hold on," she said. The lumbering beast is urged forward by an attendant armed with a sharp-pointed stick.

During the four months she visited 19 countries by means of steamship, airplane, train, bus, private automobile and by climbing up steps and down hills on foot.

In the 100 days after leaving this country on April 30 of this year, she traveled approximately 32,000 miles. From Japan and China the tour went to India, Africa, Turkey, Europe, the British Isles and home.

The group missed street riots at Colombo, Ceylon, were besieged by dirty, starving children in India, enjoyed the company of a beautiful young Indian girl (a Parsee) who acted as guide at Bombay, agreed among themselves that the tour of the Taj Mahal alone was worth the price of the trip, bought souvenirs they didn't want, saw indescribable filth and the sunset on deserts as wide as Texas.

The finest tour guide they encountered on the trip was in Israel, Mrs. Lamm stated. He told them of the work being done by specialists from many countries who are donating their services to increase the productivity of Israel.
