The bride's sister, Nadine, served as her attendant. Larry DeRosa, uncle of the bridegroom, was best man.

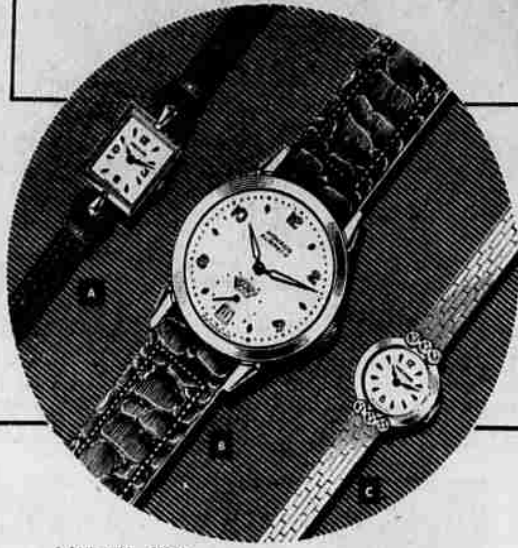
The bride is a graduate of Fort Jones High School and attended Chico State College where she was a member of Alpha Chi sorority. The newlyweds will make their

CHEESE

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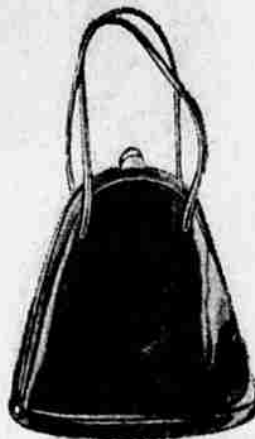
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
