GOP 'Truth Squad' Follows Demo Hopefuls

WASHINGTON (AP) — A Republican "truth squad" which has been dogging the footsteps of Adlai Stevenson and Estes Kefauver, accused the Democratic candidates of deviations ranging from demagoguery to downright misrepresentation.

The group, assigned by GOP campaign chiefs to follow up the Democrats and give the other side on factual points, returned here Sunday from a 6,500-mile air tour behind Stevenson and Kefauver. The Republicans—Sen. Frank A. Barrett (Wyo.) and Karl E. Mundt (SD) and Rep. Donald L. Jackson (Calif.)—hit 13 states and 25 communities, in most of which the Democratic ticket leaders had appeared previously.

In a report released through the Republican National Committee the three said they found the Stevenson-Kefauver campaign to be compounded of "fifty per cent demagoguery and glib generalities blended with fifty per cent of wishful thinking, distortion, misrepresentations, half-truths and complete inaccuracies."

They said they had been "forced to correct 21 instances of misrepresentations and factual inaccuracies" and mentioned the following as "characteristic" points of disagreement:

1. Which administration gave financial aid to Argentina under dictator Juan Peron. The touring lawmakers said it was the Democrats.
2. The stand taken by former REA administrator Anchor Nelson and the Eisenhower administration in general on an increase in interest rates on rural electrification loans. The GOP group said both opposed the rise.
3. What income segment got the big benefits in tax reductions under the Eisenhower administration. The Republican trio said 82 per cent went to individuals and 37 per cent of that to persons with income of \$5,000 or less.
4. Which party's votes blocked federal aid to education in the last session of Congress. The GOP group said 96 per cent of House Republicans voted for Eisenhower proposals and a party-line vote with only nine Democrats in dissent "killed all chances" for legislation on the White House plan.
5. Which is the better party to develop "new ideas" for peace.
6. Which party gets the blame for rising living costs. The GOP committee said the rise was 50 per cent in the Truman administration and 2.7 per cent since Eisenhower became president.

Investment Dividend Told

MINNEAPOLIS—The Board of Directors of Investors Mutual, Inc., largest mutual fund affiliate managed by Investors Diversified Services, Inc., has declared a regular quarterly dividend of 10 cents per share derived from investment income, plus a distribution of 15 1/2 cents per share representing realized security profits. David Dickson of Laurel, Wash., a member of the Whatcom County team, won high individual honors with 670 points.

Other members of the Whatcom County team are Gary Bailey, Ferndale, and Larry Benson, Lynden. Dickson's sister, Bonnie, is an alternate. John Westergreen of Bellingham, Whatcom County agent, is team coach.

Thirty teams from throughout the country were entered in the 4-H contest.

Robert Allen Thiel, 18, of Oregon City, Ore., was named a regional winner in the National Future Farmers of America dairy farming contest. He received a cash award of \$200.

BOSTON (UP)—More alibi witnesses appear today in the trial of eight men accused of the million dollar robbery at Brink's Inc., six years ago.

Timothy Nyhan, an employee of defendant Joseph McGinnis, testified Monday he saw his boss talking with a police lieutenant on Jan. 17, 1950, the day masked bandits crashed the money vaults.

McGinnis, who the state contends engineered the holdup, never has been placed at the robbery scene. According to bandit informer Joseph (Specs) O'Reefe, McGinnis remained at his cafe to establish an alibi while other members of the gang made the assault on Brink's Inc.



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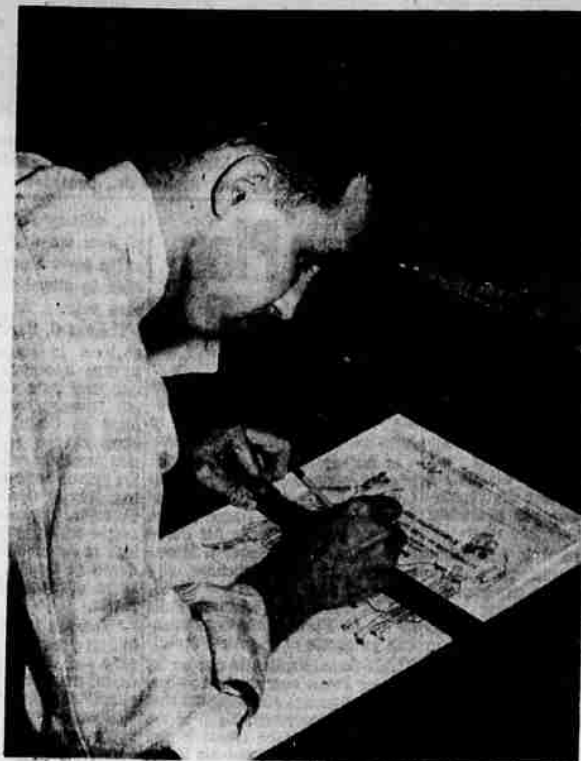
