# Michigan Over Michigan State In Bone-Crusher Pick Of NEA Scribe

Selecting any varsity to beat Michigan State this season, the football handicapper runs the risk of being called a longshot stabber.

But with Walt Kowalezyk hobbled by a badly-strained ankle, this one is picking Michigan to win the bone-crusher in Ann Arbor on Saturday afternoon, 14-7. This is even going against the old percentage, for the Wolverines prevailed the past two falls. Michigan lost little from last autumn and a pair of refugee sophomore backs from Ohio, Johnny Herrstein and Bob Placek, have given Benny Osterbaan's squad nerve it hasn't had in several campaigns.

We are sticking out our red neck even farther in Big Ten territory, naming Stanford to shade Ohio State, 13-6. Again we go against the book, for the man-eating Buckeyes are out to get even for the surprising 6-0 decision hung on them at Palo Alto in 1955. The Red Indians have the same line which contained Howard Casady and the Bucks a year ago, however, and Johnny Brodie ranks with Len Dawson of Purdue as a superior passer. Stanford played Michigan State on even terms for a half and was anything but disgraced losing to the Spartans.

Southern California figures to run over Wisconsin, 33-7; Minnesota to edge Purdue, 17-14; Iowa to shade Oregon State, 20-17; and Notre Dame to get going against Indiana, 28-7.

Duke came back to smack Virginia, 40-7, but the idea here is that Tennessee has one of its old-fashioned tailbacks in Johnny Majors and a powerhouse. Bowden Wyatt has to have. How else could the Volunteers have scored five touchdowns against Auburn? Anyway, we're taking them, 21-20, over the Blue Devils.

Tommy Mont has had two weeks of the early season to develop a quarterbacking replacement for Frank Tamburello at Maryland. The guess here is that the Terrapins have sufficient raw material to repel a fine Baylor outfit, 13-7.

Miami of Florida is too strong for Boston College, Mississippi for Houston, South Carolina for North Carolina, and Clemson for North Carolina State. Texas Christian should beat Arkansas, 25-13. West Virginia is hoped to repulse Texas, 19-14. Louisiana State is a bit too solid for Rice. The Kansas State game further illustrates how soft things have been made for an extraordinary Oklahoma array.

Army has lost Gene Mikelsonis, an outstanding sophomore tailback, for the season because of a knee injury, but Red Blaik has enough other hard hitters to beat Penn State, 26-7.

Cornell could strike back somewhat after its disappointing showing against Cornell, but not enough to handle Navy. Yale picks up steam against Brown and Colgate should manage things against Holy Cross, which beat the Red Raiders a year ago.

Pittsburgh will find the California climate salubrious, 21-0. I'm picking penalty-stricken UCLA to upset Oregon, and Illinois to get started earlier against Washington than it did against California and win by a touchdown or two.

There are many other attractive games, of course, but these are the ones that will crash the headlines.

The rocking and socking at Ann Arbor will be heard across the Great Lakes and into Canada and the battle between Michigan and Michigan State talked about for years.

# Wade Earns Starting Job

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Bill Wade has won the job as quarterback of the Los Angeles Rams from Norman Van Brocklin, but he gained it on a fluke, Coach Sid Gillman admits.

Gillman announced Thursday that Wade, former Vanderbilt star, would start Sunday against the San Francisco 49ers. "Because he won for us against Philadelphia last Sunday and he can win again," Gillman said. Wade will stay as quarterback "as long as he continues to deliver."

Van Brocklin started against Philadelphia and his first pass was intercepted and turned into an Eagle touchdown. He was taken right out and Wade worked the rest of the game. Gillman said a study of the game movies showed that Van Brocklin's arm was tipped on the pass by Eagle end Tom Scott.

Wesley, who scored on a 63 yard pass-play against the Tigers Sept. 22, was suspended from school Wednesday upon discovery he had been enrolled earlier at Lincoln, Mo., University and the University of Illinois.

Wesley's status came to light before last week's game with Southern California and he rode the bench while the Trojans were winning, 21-13.

Keene said he could not recall when any other forfeitures had been made after schools were found to have ineligible players. Faurst indicated he would not ask for a forfeit.

### OSC To Keep Grid Win Despite Ineligible Player

CORVALLIS, Ore. (UP) — Oregon State's 19-13 victory over Missouri will stay in the books as far as the Beavers are concerned even if Sam Wesley, who played a key role in the victory, later was declared ineligible.

Spec Keene, Oregon State's athletic director, outlined the school stand Thursday after Coach Don Faurst of Missouri was quoted as saying that his team would have forfeited the game under similar circumstances.

"Forfeiture of one game would not clear up the Wesley problem as far as Oregon State is concerned," Keene said. "If Sam Wesley was ineligible for the Missouri game—and we wouldn't have played him if we had had an inkling he was ineligible—he was also ineligible for all games he played for Oregon State last year as a sophomore and the year before as a freshman."

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# Maryland Grid Ace 'In' Army

BALTIMORE (AP) — It was definite Friday that Frank Tamburello is a private in the Army instead of quarterback of Maryland.

The college football star, battling the draft since June, failed Thursday to convince a federal judge that all facts about his arguments for deferment weren't considered.

Judge R. Dorsey Watkins ruled that they were considered "all up and down the line, much more thoroughly than in an ordinary case" if not by his local board.

Tamburello even wrote to President Eisenhower.

The judge turned down a petition to order the local board to give him a hearing and Tamburello went back to the Army into which he had been drafted Monday.

Whether he would be back to quarterback Maryland's football team after directing it to 15 victories in 16 games the past two seasons had been up in the air for a month. The team already has played its first two games, losing to Syracuse and winning last Saturday over Wake Forest.

Tamburello argued for a new hearing on grounds the draft board clerk gave him the wrong impression about procedure to follow and the board didn't consider his latest academic records in revoking his student's deferment.

The board ruled Tamburello no longer was eligible for deferment because he failed to make normal progress toward graduation next June.

The board reclassified him June 22. At the time, it had from the university only his grades for the previous year. The latest weren't ready until July.

The state appeals board voted 5-0 to uphold the classification and fixed the induction for last Monday.

Judge Watkins found the local board was "justified in acting on the information in its files" and that the appeals board could not have "missed" the later transcript of Tamburello's grades.

# Tour Cancelled

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (UP) — Harvard University has cancelled plans for a Southern tour by its varsity basketball team because of segregation practices in the South.

Athletic Director Thomas D. Boiles announced the action Thursday despite the fact that there are no Negro players on the Crimson squad.

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# Oregon's Ducks Get Chance At UCLA '11'

SAN FRANCISCO (UP) — Oregon's Webfoots, drubbed six straight times by UCLA since Red Sanders launched his southland era, finally have a chance for revenge tonight when they meet the weakened Bruins at Los Angeles Coliseum.

The Uclans seem down at the moment from crippling penalties brought against them this summer for violating the athletic code. Michigan buried them last Saturday, 42-13, after they had squeaked by Utah, 13-7, the week before.

At the same time, Coach Len Casanova may have come up with the best Oregon team he has formed after six years of work. The Ducks had a bad time getting by Idaho, 21-14, last week but started off with a bang by thumping Colorado, 35-0.

Oregon not only has lost all six games to Sanders' teams but crossed the Bruin goal line only once in the last five outings. The Ducks could make up for lost time tonight if Tom Crabtree's passing and Jim Shanley's speed function as usual.

In a pair of other Friday night contests, Fresno State goes after its third straight win when it meets San Diego Marines while San Francisco hosts San Diego State.

Cannons start booming again

Saturday when the Pacific Coast Conference finds itself involved with four more games against Big Ten opposition plus a key intersectional between Pittsburgh and California. The Big Ten leads so far in this year's series, 4-0.

The only bright spot for the coast appears to be the Southern California-Wisconsin game in which the Trojans have been tabbed as one-touchdown favorites. Otherwise Ohio State is 13 over Stanford, Iowa six over Oregon State, Illinois 3 over Washington and Pitt six over California.

Ohio State named Nebraska, 34-7, last week while Stanford was falling before Michigan State, 21-7. As usual, the Indians' best chances seem to ride on the passing arm of quarterback John Brodie.

Oregon State lost its top runner and pass defender when little Sam Wesley was ruled ineligible, but the Beavers did give Southern Cal a tough battle without him before toppling and could surprise Iowa.

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
