Church Plan Under Way

The migrant mission program sponsored by the Oregon and Klamath Councils of Churches is under way under the direction of Betty Whitaker, of the migrant ministry in Oregon. Miss Whitaker, who has served previously in this area will work with the migrants at the Wither's Camp at Newell and at the camp at Malin.

Migrant workers coming for the potato harvest are all invited to take part in the activities and to benefit by the services that are offered.

A building at the Newell camp has been floored with labor donated by migrants, where activities will be centered, including use of library books, a health club, sewing lessons and child care from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. for working mothers.

Christian education classes will be held for children after school, adult classes will be held late Saturday afternoons and religious films will be shown Saturday evenings.

Mrs. Dave Campbell, Tulelake will be in charge of the nursery school at Newell and will be assisted by volunteer women workers from Klamath Falls, Tulelake and Merrill churches.

October 14, has been designated as Harvest Sunday.

A film, depicting the problems of migrant workers will be shown Sunday evening, October 7.

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Paul Clemens Named Best Brush Artist In Filmland

HOLLYWOOD — The film town's most successful artist—the honest-to-goodness brush and palette kind—is a soft-spoken, mustache man from Wisconsin named Paul Clemens.

His delicate touch with soft, Renoir-like colors has made him one of America's leading portraitists and his canvases hang in New York's Metropolitan Museum of Art and other noted galleries. The fact that he has painted dozens of top movie actresses is a glamorous, but incidental factor in his career.

Clemens' favorite subject is Eleanor Parker, who is also his wife. When you visit their luxurious house on Beverly Drive, you find Eleanor all over the place — on the walls.

There's a head portrait over the mantle, a study of the back of her head, a languorous full-length pose, a scene of her singing back to a recording for her operatic role in "Interrupted Melody."

As you can judge from such commissions, he is no starver in a garret. He charges from \$500 for a small head portrait to \$8,000 for a full-length canvas.

"I've never had a rough time making a living from art," he said. "I was going to art school in Milwaukee in 1933, when times

were tough. But that only added to the glamor of being an artist."

He came to California in 1941 and has been doing a good business ever since. So much so that he tries to hold down the commission volume to devote himself to non-portrait subjects.

He has some baseball scenes he has been working on. This is an old love of his. The valiant efforts of his Milwaukee Braves inspired him to return to it.

"I don't want to discourage business," he said, "but it's necessary to get away from commis-

sions now and then. There is a sameness about doing portraits, a limitation of treatment and the

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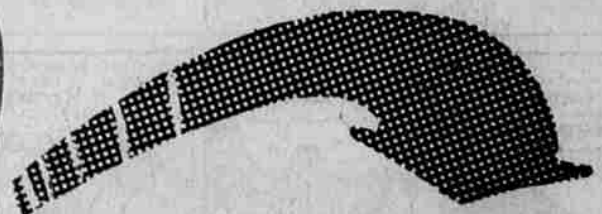
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
