Soroptimists Observe 35th Anniversary During Meet

The 35th anniversary of Soroptimism was observed at Thursday's luncheon of the local members by a program based on a history of the organization written by Ida Odell, a charter member of the Klamath Falls club. The only two other active members of the original group of 15 which accepted the Klamath Falls Soroptimist charter from the Portland club in 1938 were introduced. They are Clara Shaw and Olive Cornett.

Like many another service club, Soroptimism got its start pretty largely through the efforts of a professional organizer of service clubs, Stewart Morrow. He coined the name from the Latin component parts meaning "sister" and "the best." Six years after the first club was organized, spearheaded by Adelaide E. Goddard, Alameda County, California, Morrow sold the name to the American clubs, which then numbered about nine. He got \$5,500 for the name—on long term payments.

Today there are more than 35,000 Soroptimist members of more than 1,000 clubs in 28 countries of the world. "Facing Our Challenge" is the Soroptimist theme for the next four years, 1956 to 1960.

Special guests included Lois Carroll, a Soroptimist from Marysville, California, and Kathryn Althorne, Venture Club president. In her brief talk, she reminded the group that a member of her organization is referred to as a venturess, not a venture girl.
