Although he never pinned a murder on a shifty-eyed butler, discovered a rich millionaire was knocked off with a rare type of Oriental poison not performed any of the other feats attributed to fictional detectives, nevertheless, City Policeman Leonard Clark deserves a story.

Clark, former superintendent of the Nebraska State Crime Bureau and erstwhile chief of police in Seward, Alaska, started his career as a rug salesman in Minnesota.

"And I had it all over on any Armentian rug peddler, that ever came over the pike," he said. "I sold rugs all over Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota and Montana. I'd probably still be doing it if it hadn't been for the Big Depression."

In the early 1930s, the Billie Rug Company of Minneapolis, closed its branch in Omaha and Clark found himself in the great army of the unemployed.

It was at this juncture that Clark decided to enter the law enforcement field. His first job was patrolman on the Scottsbluff, Nebraska Police Force, while in that

fair city. Clark was married to Mildred Duncan.

In 1939, determined to advance in his new profession, Clark began an intensive study of criminology and spent three months at the FBI National Police Academy in Washington, D.C.

Clark was employed by the Nebraska State Crime Bureau and soon was named superintendent.

As he looks back on it now, he is convinced that the travel bug which bit him when he took up rug selling struck again. He quit his job in Lincoln, Nebraska and with his family headed west.

After touring the Pacific Coast, he took a job as internal security officer at the Japanese Relocation Center in Tulelake. When the camp was closed, Clark accepted a job as chief of police at Seward, Alaska. He spent three years in the north country and then came to Klamath Falls.

"Crime patterns have been changing in recent years almost as rapidly as Paris styles," he said. "Some types of lawlessness have gone out of style. For instance, you hardly ever hear of a confidence man operating anymore. This type of crook has found out that Barnum was wrong. There isn't one born every minute these days."
