Special Tax Measure Up

DUNSMUIR - Dunsuir residents may pay special taxes totaling 25 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation for additional fire and snow removal equipment if voters approve two tax measures on the November 8 ballot.
The Dunsuir City Council has passed ordinances for submission to the voters of a 15 cent tax to raise an estimated \$33,000 for snow removal and street equipment and a 10 cent tax to raise an estimated \$22,000 for fire equipment. Both taxes would be levied for the next five years.
In other business the council heard a request from the Berkeley engineering firm of Bates and Trotter to be considered for a sewer survey job in north Dunsuir. A representative of the Berkeley firm was asked to appear at the next council meeting, October 17.
John Burges, who has the Dunsuir television cable franchise, was also invited by the council to appear at the next meeting. The future policy of the cable system will be discussed.

CLASH
ALGIERS - Forty-seven nationalist rebels were shot down in clashes with French troops in Algeria over the weekend, French headquarters reported Monday. There was no estimate given of French losses.
The biggest engagement took place at Filla-Oussene, in the extreme northwest corner of Algeria. Rebel losses were said to have been 20 dead in that action.

Fall Weather Shows Again

A bright belt of clear fall weather stretched across most of the nation today.
Fair weather with temperatures in the mid 60s was forecast for the fifth game of the World Series in New York.
Scattered showers sprinkled sections of the North Atlantic coastal states and from northern California to Wyoming.
Seasonably warm weather prevailed from the Dakotas to Lake Michigan southwestward to New Mexico.
Meanwhile, a cool air mass loomed over the eastern portion of the nation from the Atlantic seaboard as far west as Texas. Temperatures were in the 40s in the north to near 60 in the south.
High readings were forecast for the eastern Great Lakes, Ohio Valley and Tennessee, Kansas and Oklahoma as warm air moved southward, pushed by a cool air mass from Canada.
