Stevenson To Appear In Portland Wednesday

Adlai Stevenson will be in Portland Wednesday — virtually accompanied by the Republican "truth squad."

Stevenson will give an address in his Democratic presidential campaign at the Portland municipal auditorium after spending the afternoon in conferences. With him, Oregon party leaders said, will be campaign managers Hy Raskin and Wilson Wyatt; co-chairman of the Volunteers for Stevenson, Mrs. Edison Dick; former ambassador to Denmark, Mrs. Eugene Anderson; and the wife of a former secretary of the Interior, Mrs. Oscar Chapman.

In the Republican "truth squad" which has been on the Stevenson campaign trail and which also will be in Portland Wednesday, are Sen. Carl Mundt of South Dakota, Sen. William Purtell of Connecticut and Rep. Donald Jackson of California.

In state campaigning, Douglas McKay said Monday proposals made by his Democratic opponent, Sen. Wayne Morse, would if carried out "produce the biggest tax increase this country has ever seen."

"He goes far beyond previous Democrat (sic) spending policies. He goes beyond his party's platform. If there is any pressure group to which he has not pledged a slice of the Treasury, it is not

of record," McKay said in a radio talk. Morse, campaigning in McMinnville, criticized what he said was the "squeeze that the Eisenhower administration's hard money, tight credit policies have put on small businessmen and farmers of America."

"What Douglas McKay targets to tell the small businessmen of Oregon about his so-called program is that the Eisenhower administration opposed the proposals he now says small businessmen need," Morse said.

Gov. Elmo Smith, GOP candidate to succeed himself, told a Hillsboro audience that the state's "major problem is its fast-grow-

ing school population." State Sen. Robert Holmes, Smith's Democratic opponent, said in a Portland talk that "it's pretty tiresome to watch him (Smith) try to climb on the education train when he did all he could to stop it from moving when he was a state senator."

Elsewhere on the political front there were these developments: Republicans announced that Secretary of Labor James P. Mitchell would be in Portland Saturday to speak at the observance of President Eisenhower's birthday anniversary.

State Sen. Monroe Sweetland, Democratic candidate for secretary of state, urged Marion Coun-

ty voters to approve a legislative sub-districting measure. Republican State Sen. Mark Hatfield, seeking the same office, called for establishment of a state mental hospital for teen-agers.

Sen. Richard Neuberger (D-Ore.), who has been campaigning for Democratic candidates, told a Canby rally that the soil bank program has not been a complete

success. "The small family-sized operations are unable to divert enough acreage from production to receive soil-bank payments of sufficiently substantial size to improve annual farm income," he said.

Two Convicts Flee Prison

SANTA FE, N.M. (UP)—Two convicted murderers serving as trustees at the recently abandoned old state penitentiary here kidnaped a prison guard Monday night, fled in his private car and were still at large today.

The guard, Jose A. Vigil, was dumped from the car unharmed early today about 50 miles north of Roswell in southern New Mexico.

State police set up road blocks in the southern New Mexico area and advised officers to use utmost caution with the two, who had been convicted of second-degree murder.

The escapees were identified as Jimmie C. Williams, 39, of Otero County and Willie Carpenter, 55, of San Juan County. Both were trustees assigned to a clean-up detail at the old prison abandoned in August.

Officers said the two apparently forced Vigil to escort them from the prison grounds. Neither was believed armed but Williams weighed 250 pounds while the guard was described as elderly.

The escape was reported after midnight when the guard failed to make his hourly check with the new state penitentiary office.

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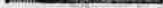
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
