Veterans To Receive Big Insurance Dividend Soon

WASHINGTON (AP)—Some 5,350,000 veterans will receive about 230 million dollars in dividends on veterans administration insurance during 1956.

Veterans Administrator Harvey V. Higley, announcing this today, said all the payments will be "regular annual dividends, not special dividends."

However, some 20,000 veterans holding U.S. Government Life Insurance term policies will get their first dividend in 25 years, sharing about one million dollars.

A VA spokesman said there was no political significance in the fact that these veterans received their last dividend in 1932, during the Republican administration of President Herbert Hoover, and that their next "annual" dividend, 25 years later, was announced in this election year by the Eisenhower administration.

Visitor — from Tulelake for a week is Mrs. O. C. Wells at the Bonanza home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Owen Pepple.

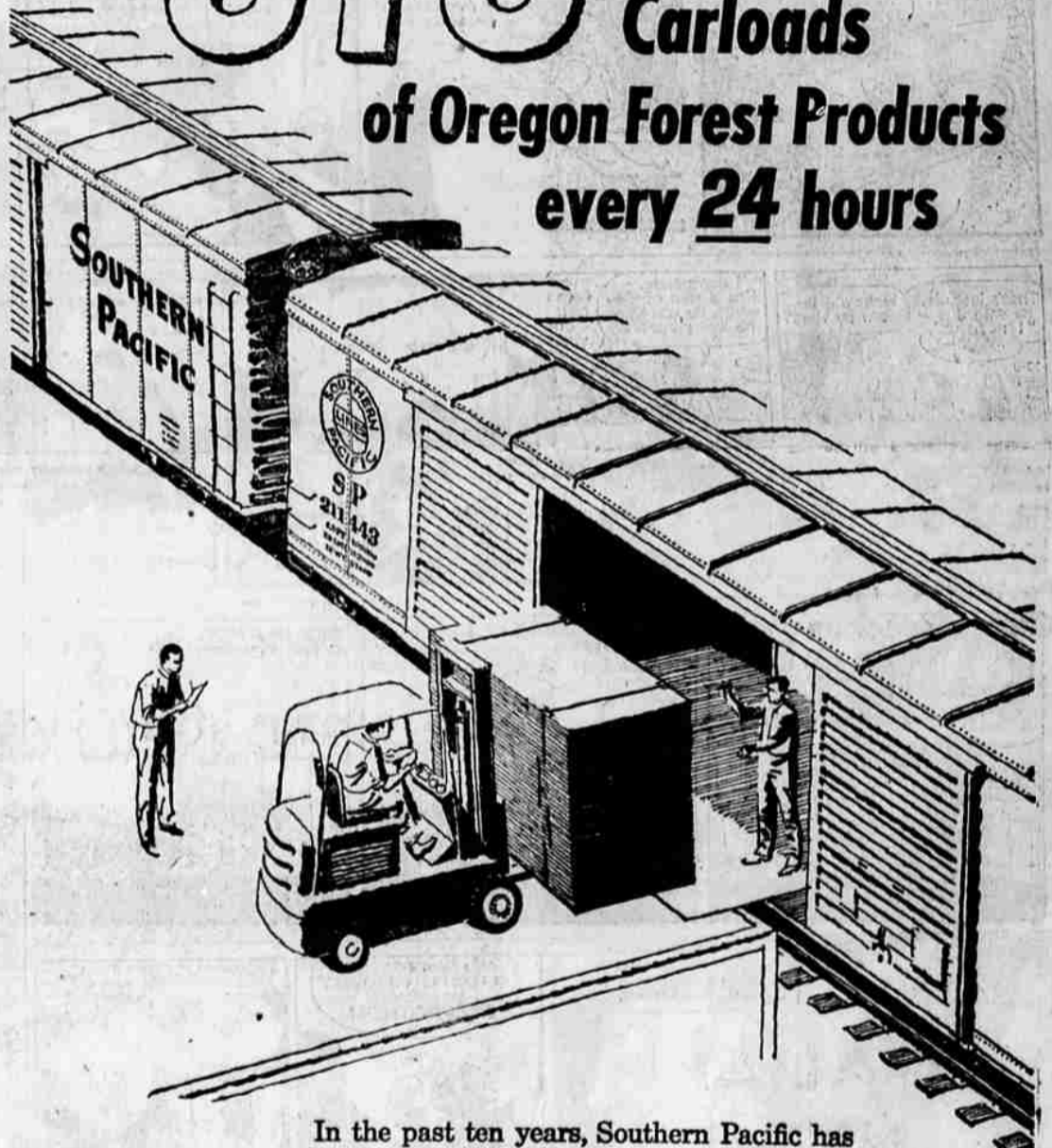

Pair Trapped Under Steel

PERRY, Mich. (AP)—An elderly couple was trapped two hours in their automobile under 20 tons of steel yesterday when a semitrailer truck loaded with wheels toppled on their car.

The load was sinking down on Williams Nichols, 74, and his wife Agnes, 77, of Battle Creek, Mich., when a trucker hauling heavy timbers and carrying hydraulic jacks, happened by.

Using the timbers and jacks, volunteers shored up the heavy semitrailer while one of the workmen broke a window and pulled Nichols and his wife to safety. The couple escaped with only bruises.

The car driven by Mrs. Nichols struck an oncoming vehicle a glancing blow while attempting to pass another vehicle. The Nichols car swerved across the highway and into the side of the semitrailer truck.

The trailer load of steel automobile wheels toppled onto the Nichols car, crushing in the top and pinning the couple in the front seat.
