Students Die During Prank

HOUSTON, Tex. (AP) — Two Rice Institute sophomores were killed on the campus here Tuesday night while carrying out a prank.

Karl B. Bailey, 19, of Houston, died of carbon monoxide poisoning as he hung from the ladder inside the campanile — the combination smokestack and bell tower of the mechanical laboratory building.

Cecil William Carroll, 19, also of Houston, fell to his death when he started climbing up the inside of the smokestack to rescue his friend.

The youths and two others intended to climb up inside the

smokestack and hang from the top of it an automobile tire, the trophy of the winning section in the so-called tire grab. This is a greased tire, for possession of which groups of students scuffle on a playing field during the events of the freshman guidance program.

The other two youths said they thought that by hanging the tire from the top of the campanile they could keep other groups of students from stealing the trophy.

Bailey went up the ladder, carrying a rope, and had nearly reached the top when he began moaning. Carroll went up the ladder to his aid, but complained of hot air in the stack and moments later plunged to the bottom and was killed.

Bailey's body was brought down by firemen. One of his feet had caught in a rung and was hanging inside the stack, head down.

School Offers Insurance Plan

DUNSMUIR — Parents of school children will be invited to buy school accident insurance protection, it was decided at the Dunsmuir Elementary School Board meeting on Monday evening. An individual policy can be purchased by the parents covering the child while at school and en route to or from school.

This policy was first offered through the school last year when the board decided the cost of blanket accident insurance was prohibitive. Costs for the individual policy are \$1.50 per child per year.

Other school board business included a report on the junior college meeting, the gamma globulin inoculation program for measles, a discussion of gasoline bids for bus service, and a discussion on provisions for a Siskiyou County Juvenile Home.

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Fish Production Figures Told

MOUNT SHASTA — Eastern brook trout are reproducing in Castle Lake, 10 miles southwest of Mount Shasta, and rainbow trout are not, it was found by J. H. Wales, ichthyologist of the fish and game department.

Wales kept a check on all fish caught during five days of each week over a period of some six weeks to discover what has happened to fish life in the lake since it was cleared in 1946. Both rainbow and Eastern brook were planted in 1947. Rainbow, according to Wales, need a running stream for spawning so additional plantings of rainbow trout will be made from time to time to keep the ratio.

Angling pressure is high in this lake, Wales said, and few fish taken exceed 12 inches in length.

Death Probe To Continue

ROSEBURG (AP) — Investigation will be continued into the cause of death of Burt Kimbrough Duckett, 26, Sutherlin, who jumped from a police car the night of Oct. 2. A coroner's jury Tuesday night found his death from a skull injury inflicted "by means and person unknown."

The jurors recommended that investigation go on. Dist. Atty. Robert M. Stults said he would confer Wednesday with State Police Sgt. Robert Keefe.

Sgt. Manuel Boyes, acting director of the state's crime detection laboratory, testified that a blood test showed Duckett was drunk. He had been arrested as drunk on the highway, placed in a state police car and he then jumped from it to the pavement.

But the autopsy report said death could have been due to blows received before the fall. Jury Foreman Hans T. Hansen said this prompted the jury to feel that further study was warranted.

At Tuesday night's inquest Coroner L. L. Powers called three women to try to run down a rumor that someone had been heard to say, "If they knew what I heard and seen the results of this investigation would be different."

Mrs. Virginia Bernice Good, Sutherlin nurse who drove by shortly after Duckett had jumped and stayed to offer help, said she had made no such comment. The other women said they hadn't heard anyone say it.

Missing Hunters Found Today

ONTARIO, Ore. (AP) — Two hunters, a boy and a man, were found Wednesday after being missing overnight in eastern Oregon.

Oregon State Police said Joel Bristol, 9, of Portland, walked into a search group after daybreak, after becoming separated from his father and brother east of Juntura.

The U. S. Bureau of Land Management in Vale said George Sweet, 65, Nyssa, Ore., was found about 9 a.m. in the Westfall area north of Harper. Both were reported unharmed.

Lake Residents To Visit Mexico

NEW YORK (AP) — The whereabouts of actress Margaret Sullivan remains a mystery Wednesday, cloaked in a fog of conflicting reports.

The husky-voiced, 45-year-old veteran of stage and screen failed to show up to play the starring role in a CBS-TV drama Monday night.

Her husband, Kenneth A. Wagg, said afterward she was ill and in a hospital. But he declined to say where.

Another report said she was well and staying with friends somewhere.

Meanwhile, CBS started looking for another actress to appear in the "Studio One" play cancelled Monday night at a \$40,000 loss to the network.

Miss Sullivan was to have played the lead in a story about a Roman Catholic nun who learned to pilot a plane.

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
