

### Girl Quits Beauty Try

BIRMINGHAM, England (AP) — Honey-blond Miss New Zealand said today she has walked out on the Miss World contest because she can't face parading in a bathing suit. And besides, she has hardly a thing to wear.

The reluctant beauty, 29-year-old Jeanette de Montalk, vanished from London two days ago. She was to have competed against girls from a score of nations next Monday for the title of Miss World.

A reporter found her living in a YWCA hostel here, adamant in her decision not to participate.

"I'm finished with it," announced the green-eyed young lady. "I do not want to parade in a bathing costume before hundreds of people."

"Furthermore, I do not own the sort of clothes to compete with some of the girls."

"My wardrobe is only a normal one bought by my family and friends who rallied around at home. Some of the girls have Dior gowns."

### Orville Hodge Accused Of Lying To Committee

CHICAGO (AP) — The top three figures in Illinois' 1 1/2-million-dollar state swindle appeared before a Senate committee yesterday, but two refused to talk and the other was accused of lying.

The big man in the massive state check-cashing scheme—Orville E. Hodge, imprisoned former state auditor—answered former questions but drew the anger of Sen. Fulbright (D-Ark), committee chairman.

"You are lying to this committee," Fulbright told Hodge.

The other two men—also imprisoned for their part in the huge fraud—are Edward A. Hintz, former president of the Southmoor Bank in Chicago, who cashed Hodge's illegal state checks, and Edward A. Epping, chief lieutenant in Hodge's office, who said he was the Republican auditor's "messenger boy."

**DECLINED TO ANSWER**  
Hintz and Epping declined to answer questions while TV, still and motion picture cameras and recording machines were operating in the hearing being held by the Senate Banking and Currency Committee.

Hodge testified, but continued his objection to being personally televised and TV cameras avoided his face.

Fulbright offered to make the same arrangement for Hintz but the portly 67-year-old banker refused. Fulbright then said he will recommend that Hintz, who is serving a three-year prison sentence, be cited for contempt of the Senate. He did not say he would make such a recommendation against Epping, who is serving a five-year prison sentence.

Hodge's testimony included statements that:  
His campaigns for the GOP nomination as state auditor in the 1952 spring primary and in the subsequent November election cost about \$200,000—none of it stolen money.

No one else got any of the embezzled money.

**NOT COVERING**  
He is not "covering up" for anybody and was not a target for blackmailers or extortionists.

He neither reported nor paid federal income taxes on the state cash he pocketed.

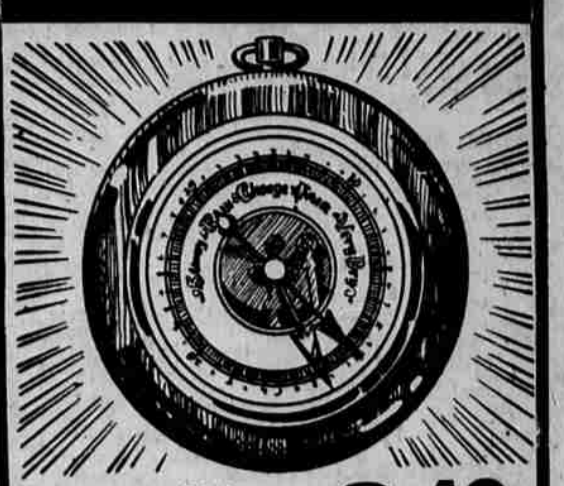

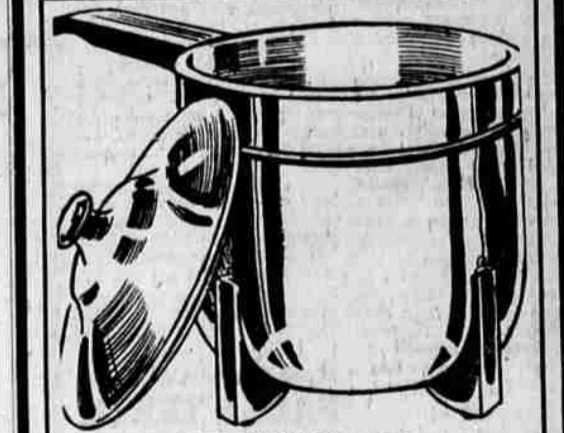
