Hunt Resumes Brothers Hold Children In Bizarre Ransom Try For Airman

PORT ANGELES, Wash. - Ground parties searching for an airman missing since last Thursday combed the rugged Olympic Peninsula again Tuesday without finding a trace of 1st Lt. Robert L. Canup.

Canup was one of four airmen who parachuted after two F89D Scorpion jet fighter-interceptors on a routine patrol flight out of Paine Air Force Base, Everett, collided in flight Thursday evening.

The other three airmen walked out of the wilderness to safety during the following two days. Salisbury, 25, is from Salisbury, N.C.

National park rangers Tuesday established a base camp near Mt. Olympus as a headquarters for ground parties seeking Canup. The wreckage of the plane Canup was flying was found near the mountain over the weekend.

Blast Injures Six Persons

GLENWOOD, Iowa (UP) - An explosion shattered the interior of a two-story packing plant early today, injuring at least six men, including a rabbi.

The blast, which jarred the area for miles around, touched off a small fire in the Roth Packing Co. plant but it was quickly extinguished.

One of the injured was Rabbi Isaac Block, Omaha, who suffered serious second degree burns and was hospitalized at nearby Council Bluffs.

The plant devotes a sizeable part of its production to Kosher meat and Rabbi Block apparently was assigned to the plant today. Three other men were hospitalized.

The explosion apparently was touched off by a gas leak, officials said.

STREETCARS BURNED

TRONDHEIM, Norway - A carbarn fire blamed on a short circuit early Wednesday destroyed 42 street cars, almost the only source of public transport for the 56,000 people of this central Norwegian port. Three cleaning women who had been working in the barns were missing and believed dead. Four others escaped.

TERRAZZANO, Italy - Police stormed a village school Wednesday night and liberated 95 children and 4 teachers held prisoner for ransom by two berserk brothers. None of those in the school was harmed.

The children - between 6 and 10 years old - had been held at gunpoint for six hours by Arturo and Osvaldo Santato, who demanded two million lire (\$380,000) to release them.

A full battalion (almost 700 men) of national police attacked the building after the director of an asylum for the criminally insane from which one brother recently was released warned that the youth was growing more maniacal by the moment.

The brothers had threatened to blow up the children with dynamite or scar them with acid unless given the money.

Italian police, prevented from shooting by the brothers' use of the girl teachers as shields, finally went in with guns blazing.

They wounded both Arturo, the madman, and Osvaldo, the young-

er brother whom police described as a near-moron under Arturo's domination. Near-hysterical parents tried to lynch the pair when, manacled, they were brought into a courtyard outside the two-story school. Police fought back the crowd and took them away.

Moments later the children streamed out into the arms of weeping parents.

Arturo pumped two bullets at his own sister just before the police assault. She had been trying to persuade him to give up.

The gunmen also fired on three parents - two men and a woman - who entered the school in an attempt to free their children before the police arrived.

The woman, Mrs. Irene Lingeri, was wounded in one leg before she could reach her son, Gianni. Terrazzano, a village of less than 1,000 population, lies eight miles north of Milan.

At noon, the brothers permitted police to carry food for the children to the entrance. Using a

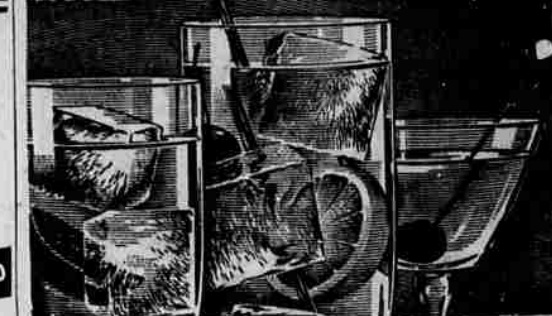
teacher for a shield, one gunman moved the food inside. The two brothers had climbed on their motorcycles about 11 a.m. at nearby Rho, a town of 25,000. They rode to Terrazzano and entered the school. Brandishing guns, they took over.

The Santato brothers - 27 and 22 years old - shot one man dead during the final attack. One of mad Arturo's two guns jammed when he was firing at his sister, which may have prevented more casualties in the final gunfight.
