Big Crowd Greet Adlai At Portland Appearance

Democrats held the center of political attention in Oregon Wednesday as their presidential candidate, Adlai Stevenson, spoke in Portland to a crowd too big by many hundreds to get into the municipal auditorium.

In just a week—next Thursday—will be the Republicans' turn with President Eisenhower in Portland for a speech at the same auditorium. Before then, on Saturday, Secretary of Labor Mitchell will speak in the president's behalf in Portland.

During Stevenson's visit, in the course of which he lauded Sen. Wayne Morse and spoke critically of Morse's opponent, Doug McKay, he was told to be optimistic about carrying Oregon. Morse said he had told Stevenson he would win. He added to interviewers he thought he would beat McKay by about 95,000 votes and said he thought there wouldn't be much difference between his and Stevenson's vote total.

Some polls have indicated that Morse's chances of winning are better than are Stevenson's. In 1952 Eisenhower got 69.9 per cent of the Oregon vote, beating Stevenson by 150,000.

Stevenson, in addition to supporting Morse, said words of praise, too, for Rep. Edith Green and for state Sen. Robert Holmes, candidate for governor.

At a meeting of the women's activities department of the AFL-CIO Committee on Political Education, Stevenson noted that Democrats lead in registration in more than two-thirds of the Oregon counties and he credited the women with adding "many thousands" to the registrations.

While Morse was introducing Stevenson at Portland, McKay was addressing a dinner meeting at Klamath Falls in which he stressed the Eisenhower theme of "peace, prosperity and progress."

Speaking of his administration in the Department of the Interior, McKay said that on one item alone his department saved 15 million dollars without sacrificing an essential service.

Stiffer Jail Terms Asked

POZNAN, Poland (AP) — The Communist prosecution appealed Thursday for an increase in the sentences passed Monday in the first Poznan riot trial, charging the court erred in applying a too-mild law.

The sentences were 4 to 4½ years imprisonment imposed on three youths accused of murder in the fatal beating of a police corporal during the June 29 "bread and freedom" uprising.

The prosecution maintained that the court should have applied a law which provides for a minimum of 10 years in prison for assault on a public official. The appeal goes to the Polish Supreme Court in Warsaw for decision.

Meanwhile, trial No. 3 continued Thursday with more witnesses called in the cases of eight rioters charged with attacking police and soldiers, storming public buildings and freeing prisoners.

There was no indication when a start would be made on four other trials. They seem to have been postponed indefinitely.

Terror Brings School Holiday

TERRAZZANO, Italy (AP) — Terror day at Terrazano School — six fearful hours in which students and teachers were held hostage by two berserk brothers armed with guns, acid and dynamite—brought an unexpected holiday to 97 children between 6 and 10.

A week's vacation so that the youngsters could forget Wednesday's ordeal was announced by school authorities.

Each child will have a medical examination to see whether any suffered physical injuries or mental scars from the day.

Police identified the brothers as Arturo and Osvaldo Santato, aged 27 and 22. They said Arturo, who was shot Wednesday, had just been released from a criminal lunatic asylum. Osvaldo, they said was "a near moron—completely dominated by his brother."

ON THE COAST

In the Fourth Congressional District, both Republican Rep. Harris Ellsworth and Democratic candidate Charles Porter spoke to coastal audiences.

Ellsworth at Gold Beach said he will attempt, in the next Congress, to get an appropriation for the Rogue River Harbor project. This job, calling for a ship channel and turning basin, has been authorized and no money has been appropriated. Its cost is estimated at \$3,950,000.

Porter, at Bandon, said that Ellsworth used his committee power to block passage of the Senate-passed housing bill. Porter said this hurt the lumber industry and "put employment in his own district in a deep freeze coma."

British Battle Against Second Chinese Rioters

HONG KONG (AP) — British troops and police battled with rioters, bayonets and tear gas Thursday against frenzied mobs of Chinese rioting and pillaging for the second straight day on Hong Kong's mainland Kowloon Peninsula.

At least eight Chinese were reported dead in the century's worst outbreak of violence in the British crown colony packed to the explosion point with refugees from Communist China.

Foreigners, leftists and their property, and police stations were the chief targets of the mob. But there was also considerable indiscriminate looting and pillaging. Hundreds of persons were injured, including a Swiss couple badly burned when a mob set fire to their taxi. The flames incinerated the taxi driver.

Some of the mobs stopped cars and extorted money from the occupants. At dusk, the troops and police appeared to be slowly bringing the mobs under control. Acting Gov. E. B. David ordered a curfew for Kowloon's 1½ million people from 7:30 p. m. to 10 a. m. He said it might be extended if necessary.
