WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower said Thursday the difference between his administration and the Democratic leadership is that the Democrats are not particularly concerned with maintaining a sound dollar.

### Western Ministers Begin Third Secret Suez Meet

UNITED NATIONS (AP) — The foreign ministers of Britain, France and Egypt went into a third private meeting with U. N. Secretary General Dag Hammarskjold Thursday in another effort to settle the Suez problem. They scheduled another conference Thursday afternoon after a closed door session of the 11-nation Security Council. But there was no sign any progress had been made toward a solution.

### Polio Vaccine Probe Gets Off To Stormy Beginning

WASHINGTON (AP) — A House inquiry into polio vaccine pricing got off to a stormy start Thursday when Rep. Reese (R-Tenn) charged that the polio program was being made a "political football" just before election day.

Reese is the lone Republican member of a House Government Operations subcommittee investigating government vaccine purchases and pricing practices of drug manufacturers. He said at the outset he had "grave apprehensions" over an inquiry at this time.

Eisenhower said the Republican administration stands for economy, sound handling of fiscal affairs, and the greatest possible decentralization of government.

Recalling a quotation he attributed to Thomas Jefferson to the effect that the least government is the best government, Eisenhower said his administration seeks to give the maximum responsibility to state and local governments, with the federal government coming in as a quick and willing partner when needed.

The remarks were prompted by a reporter who asked Eisenhower's views on what are the real issues which will settle the election.

Eisenhower said the issues boil down to the management of the country's affairs at home.

The Republicans, he said, are more concerned about avoiding interference in things that people can do for themselves.

While the country must advance such programs as unemployment insurance, social security, health programs and education, Eisenhower said, it must also give room for the effort and ingenuity of a free people to produce the great results of which they are capable.

The Democratic Party, Eisenhower added, starts from the other end. He said the Democratic philosophy is to start with the government and run things from there.
