The GAA organization ordered 500 balloons in the shape of a football. They will be purple and gold and will be sold for 25 cents at the football games.

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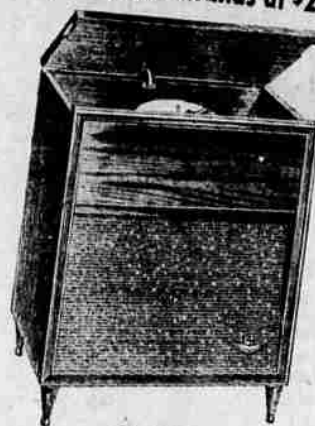


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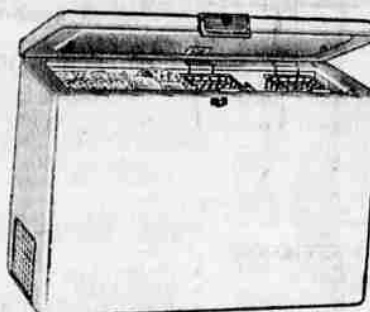
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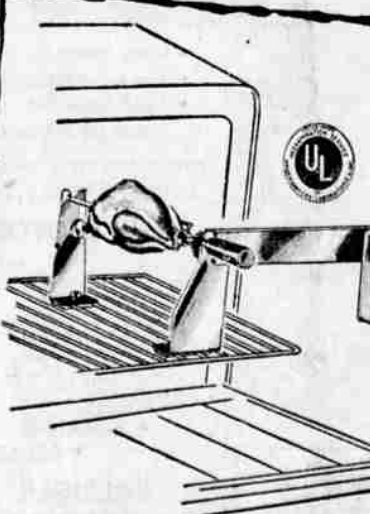


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
