**LOWER TAXES FOR OREGON FAMILIES**  
"I am against high taxes and big government"

**Q. Do you really think taxes can be cut?**

**A.** Taxes can be cut. They have been cut. I was there. Big government and big taxes are inseparable. When the Eisenhower administration cut big government it was able to balance the budget and at the same time give the people of this country the biggest tax cut of all history—a whopping \$7.4 billion dollars. And 62% went to individuals.

**Q. Is big government and big taxes an issue?**

**A.** Emphatically . . . yes! The spending proposals of my opponent, if adopted, would make government bigger and would require the largest tax increase of all time. He has promised a slice of the treasury to every pressure group of record—going far beyond the Democrat party platform. He would have to ask for tax increases.

**Q. Can you prove you can cut taxes?**

**A.** Let's look at the record. As Secretary of Interior we turned the continuous red ink annual loss of the Alaskan Railroad into a \$6 million dollar profit in three years while improving service. In another department we streamlined the processing of applications, speeded service, and saved over \$280,000. We saved \$15,000,000 on another item of operating costs. This administration has proved cost and taxes can be cut without sacrificing essential services.

**Q. How can we cut taxes without losing highways, schools and other things we need?**

**A.** We cut government costs but we did more. We put five million more people to work. They pay taxes and that eases the load for everyone. We achieved the highest peak of national income in all history. People earn more . . . they pay more taxes even at lower rates . . . and the additional tax income can be divided between lower taxes and the expansion of needed government services.

**Q. How does all this affect my family budget?**

**A.** It will add to family income and family dollars will go farther. Lower taxes mean more take home pay. The sound policies of this administration stopped runaway inflation that in seven Truman years raised the cost of living 49%. We slowed that down to a 2 1/2% increase in four years and we are still working on it—to make your dollars buy more . . . and wage increases mean something.
