Mining Acreage To Be Slashed

PORTLAND — The Forest Service proposes to withdraw 3,594 acres from mining operations in the Fremont National Forest.

A filing at the land office here disclosed the intention to withdraw the lands. If the withdrawal is made permanent, no mining locations may be made on the land. In the meanwhile mining claims may not be staked out.

The Bureau of Land Management said a description of the land will be posted soon at Portland and in the courthouse, post office and district range manager's office at Lakeview.
